ACTIVE MOVEMENT IN COPPER SHARES

RISE IN NORTH BUTTE STOCK RESPONSIBLE FOR DEMAND.

Present Condition of Market, While Lacking Excitement of the Boom Days, Is More Substantial—Tom Cole a Factor in Popularizing Shares That Are Subscribed For Several Times Over.

Marquette, Mich., Nov. 28.—The years 1899 and 1900, often referred to as the "time of the big boom in copper," are not to be compared in many ways with the present condition of the market in copper mining shares. Many old-timers who have been "against the cushion" as a result of the squeeze that followed the collapse of the market say that those were the days of a real boom, and that the present market is nothing like it. The volume of business done today, however, is many times larger than it was at any time during the excitement of the boom, and it possesses the additional feature of a more substantial and less demonstrative basis. The end is by no means in sight. The market continues "stout," and as soon as money becomes easier an even more active speculation is looked for.

While the foundation of the present active movement in "coppers" is the high price the mines are receiving for their product, the 37-cent market netting rich returns, the secondary rise in North Butte stock has had much to do with the market's bullish tone. Early last spring, when the proposition was floated by Thomas F. Cole of Duluth, president of the Steel corporation's Oliver Iron Mining company, and his associates in the previously highly successful flotation of the Calumet & Arizona group in the Bisbee (Ariz.) copper camp, and North Butte became a factor on the Boston curb, the stock market was in a receptive mood and ready to receive the stimulating influence it was soon proved the newcomer possessed.

Rush to Buy Stock.

Immense profits had been made in the rampant speculation in the stocks of the Calumet & Arizona group, and when it was announced that the North Butte proposition was to be floated by the same people at the same time, the market "got in on the ground floor." The stock was subscribed several times over.

Four hundred thousand shares of the capitalization of the North Butte company were issued at the flotation price of \$15 per share, and after a few weeks of small trading, during which time the quotation hung around \$18 to \$25, the upward march began. The stock was listed on the Boston exchange, and as the trading increased the price advanced with accelerated speed until within the past month it has made more than 40 points in the face of heavy selling. Its increase in stock valuation of \$25,000,000 has made many persons wealthy. Much of the stock is held in British and Pittsburg, considerable of it in the Michigan copper country and probably almost a quarter of it on the Lake Superior iron ranges. Marquette county, the former home of Mr. Cole, alone possesses fully 50,000 shares, now worth nearly \$4,000,000.

The fact that Thomas F. Cole, who as president of the Oliver Iron Mining company has charge of all the Steel corporation's vast iron mining interests in the Lake Superior region, was associated in the flotation of North Butte, assisted in popularizing the stock more than any other one thing.

Made Many Persons Rich.

Cole made scores of persons rich in the Bisbee stocks and took care of every person he knew, and of men he did not know. The faith of the people of the Lake Superior region in the Duluth man's judgment of what constitutes copper mine is as strong as an Arab's faith in the teachings of Mahomet.

There are many men in this country who will retire rich in worldly goods, comparatively speaking, in consequence of Tom Cole getting them in "on the inside." Some men hold as much as 1,000 shares, and allotments of 100 to 500 shares are frequent. When it was announced erroneously the other day that Cole was about to float another Arizona proposition like the Bisbee stock he was deluged with letters from all over the Lake Superior region begging to
