CREAMERY MEN WILL SOON BE ARRESTED

Enforcement of the new ordinance prohibiting the sale of milk from unlicensed dairies today and the first result will be the arrest of a number of local creamery men who receive their milk and cream by rail from various points.

When a Chicago Great Western train arrived today hundreds of gallons of milk from Rice and Goodhue counties, Dr. A. A. Keys, the city veterinarian and Milk Inspector W. D. McCall, with a number of assistants, were on hand.

All the local dairymen have had their milk tested and a number of them have suffered great monetary loss by the condemnation of diseased animals. They insist that the enforcement of the law apply to the country shippers.
