May Goes Up to 87 1/2c and December to 82 1/2c, Woodworth Leading the Rise.

Receipts Light, Cash Demand Good and Bearish World's Statistics.

Foreign Markets Irregular, Some Higher and Some Lower.

Minneapolis Chamber of Commerce, Dec. 5.—Wheat crept up another notch today in the cash market, principally on light local receipts and cash demand.

The market strengthened again on Woodworth's report of the wheat market in the West, showing a decrease of 700,000 bu. on that crop.




