**SOUTH DAKOTA LAND DEPARTMENT ADOPTS PROGRESSIVE**

**FUTURE ERRORS IN SCHOOL RETURNS TO BE CHECKED.**

South Dakota Commissioner Will Compel Officials to Make Sworn Statements of Educational Census that the Fund Apportionment May Be Made More Equitable—New Board Incorporates at Pierre.

Pierre, S. D., Dec. 7.—Last year the state land department found a great deal of trouble in the enforcement of the provisions of chapter 64 of the laws of 1904, which required school officers to make sworn statements as to their returns of school census. In the past such returns had been made and the state school fund apportioned on the number of school children returned, there was a strong temptation on the part of some of the school officers to make the returns as glowing as possible. When the reports began to come in it was found necessary to return many of them with sworn statements, and in some cases the report was returned several times before it was finally completed. To save recurrence of this trouble, Land Commissioner Bach is sending a circular to county superintendents, calling their attention to the importance of the school fund, and the matter with their school officers at their winter meetings.

By the time the apportionments for next year are made there will be another factor considered in chapter 108 of the 1905 session, which requires that the different state school districts be excluded from the lists of the counties in which schools are located, when the amount of the school fund is made. The intent of this is that when the state is paying for the education of pupils in state schools, such pupils are not entitled to share of the general funds when distributed. By listing them the county in which such state schools are located gets a double benefit, and this is not intended.

**NORTH DAKOTA GETS PROUD**

**Showing of National Banks Gives State Cause for Elation.**

FARGO, N. D.—North Dakotans are elated over the showing of the national banks of this state since the change in the present national laws providing that national banks can be organized with only \$25,000. From March 3, 1900, to Sept. 30, 1905, there were eighty-nine new institutions organized in North Dakota with a total capital of \$1,250,000. The North Dakota figures are as great as Oregon, equal to Nebraska and almost as great as Kansas. In New England the only state that exceeded North Dakota was Massachusetts.
