CITY NEWS LINDEKE WOULD TAKE NOMINATION

SAYS HE WOULD MAKE RUN FOR GOVERNORSHIP.

St. Paul Dry Goods Man Declares That He Is Not Going to "Scramble" for Office and That if His Candidacy Will Embarrass Party He Will Not Run.

"In a receptive sense, I am a candidate for the republican nomination for governor. I do not wish to be a candidate, however, if my candidacy will in any way embarrass the party," continues Mr. Lindeke. "The situation in the last republican gubernatorial campaign must be borne in mind, and everything done next time to abolish the friction and those much-to-be-regretted conditions which arose and went from bad to worse till the party was thrown down."

"I am not going to 'scramble' for the office. If the party desires to let me have the nomination, I shall take it and fully appreciate the honor. But I will refuse to press my candidacy and make any display of it."
