FALSE RAIDS BY POLICE



PRES. ROOSEVELT ON THE MASSACHUSETTS LAW (From his Boston address, Aug. 25, 1902.) "Here in Massachusetts you have what I regard as, on the whole, excellent corporation laws. I think that most of our difficulties would be in a fair way of solution if we had the power to put on the national statute books, and did put on them, laws for the nation like those you have here, on the subject of corporations in Massachusetts."

SPECULATORS MUST PAY FULL INTEREST New York, Dec. 30.—Speculators who now have marginal interests in stocks which are being carried by New York stock exchange brokers, must pay the high rate of interest which now prevails, under a ruling made today by a committee of commissions of the exchange. The committee today caused personal notice to this effect to be given to several members. It has been rumored in the street for a number of days that brokers were making a loan rate to certain customers at a less rate than they themselves had to pay. This practice, the committee rules, amounts to a deduction of commissions and must not be continued. Under this ruling the individual broker must compute the average rate he is paying on all his loans and charge his customers accordingly.
