BURKE WANTS TO RETURN TO HOUSE

South Dakota Congressman Announces He Is a Candidate for Renomination.

Washington, Jan. 10. - Congressman Charles H. Burke of South Dakota says he is a candidate for renomination, and makes the following statement: "The republican state convention having been called, it would not seem out of place for me to state that I will be a candidate for renomination before the convention, tho a formal announcement is hardly necessary, as it has generally been understood that I am desirous of continuing in congress.

"Since I was first elected I have entirely given up engaging in any business and have devoted my entire time and attention to my official duties. To the fullest extent of my strength and ability I have honestly endeavored at all times to do that which would best promote the development and interests of my state. Politically, I have steadfastly supported the republican party, and have never, in a single instance, opposed an excessive, I have generally been understood that I am desirous of continuing in congress.

"Upon the question of extending the power of the interstate commerce commission, to enable it to fix a rate when the rate has been challenged and when upon hearing and full investigation the same is found to be unreasonable and excessive, I have in favor of the Townsend-Esch bill, and do not stand squarely with President Roosevelt.

"During the winter of 1904 and 1905, as member of the committee on interstate and foreign commerce, I attended almost daily, meetings of the committee for a period of weeks, during the very full and exhaustive hearings that were held upon the question of railway rates. Upon the conclusion of hearings, I voted and co-operated with a majority of said committee in perfecting and reporting the so-called Townsend-Esch bill, which was known to have the approval of the president, and at no time did I support or vote for any other bill on the subject.

"When the Townsend-Esch bill was considered in the house, I not only voted for the measure, but made a speech in support of the same, stating in unequivocal terms my opinion in favor of the proposed legislation.

"I still stand committed to the president's rate policy and shall, I hope, in the future, join a majority of the committee on interstate and foreign commerce, of which I am still a member, in reporting a new measure embodying the president's ideas and having his approval.

Basis of Candidacy.

"I shall base my candidacy for renomination entirely upon my official record, and the credit which I have herebefore received, I am indeed grateful. Having been renominated three successive times by acclamation, and having been elected by an increased majority each time, from a majority in 1894 of about 4,000, to nearly 50,000 in 1904, I have felt that my services have been satisfactory to my constituents, which has been exceedingly gratifying to me.

"If I should again be renominated and elected, I intend to do my best in the past, endeavoring to do that which will be for the best interests of the great state which I have the honor, and part, in representing, and to continue to uphold the principles and policies of the republican party as expressed in platform declarations made in representative delegate conventions."

Rochester Prisoner Believed to Have Shot Hayfield-Frank.

DODGE CENTER, MINN. - Frank McVey, a prisoner in the jail at Rochester, who had been held in custody at Dodge Center, Minn., on charge of robbing the postoffice at that place, is suspected of possessing personal knowledge of the murder of Hayfield-Frank. McVey was shot dead in a pistol fight with another man, who was burglarizing a store one night last month.

McVey also is suspected of robbing the postoffice here.
