IMITATION OF SILK ANNOYS ITALIANS

IT WILL NOT STAND THE WEAR OF THE REAL ARTICLE.

It Is Produced in Several Ways, but All Having Cellulose as the Base—It Is Very Inflammable and Dangerous for Dress Ends or Curtains.

London Times. An imitation of silk, which so closely resembles the real article that a casual observer will hardly detect the difference, has been introduced in Italy, according to Neville Rolfe, the British consul general at Naples.

The cellulose is first transformed into gun cotton, which is dissolved in alcohol and ether and passed through a fine sieve. It may be dissolved in other ways, but the result is practically the same; it becomes a vegetable fiber like cotton linters, rayon, or paper pulp.

It must be admitted that the artificial silk has a finer luster, but on the other hand, it has many important drawbacks. It will not stand being pulled, it has but little elasticity, its specific gravity is far greater than that of silk, it is very inflammable, and at the slightest friction it gives off a damp it tears easily.

At first sight it appears to be so, since it is quoted at from 24 to 28 lire per kilo (scarcely under 10s a pound), but as the density of the article is one-half greater than that of true silk, the weight to cover the same superficies will be one-half more, so the former will cost 50 per cent more.

No doubt, as methods improve, artificial silk will become more and more popular, but the variety of the processes and the expense of the plant make it doubtful that it can ever fall below certain tolerable limits.


