CHICAGO MAY END FOOTBALL AT ONCE

Angry at Michigan, Dean Small Threatens to Suspend the Game.

Chicago, Jan. 25.—Michigan's attack upon the University of Chicago football representatives at the late conference charging the midway authorities with trickery and bad faith in bringing the other colleges into certain reform movements, may lead to the entire abandonment of football at the midwest camp.

Game in Balance. "Michigan's attitude through the conference was that of a leader and not that of a unwilling participant, as the late charges hold. Her representative came, as a matter of fact, with the most radical instructions from his ruling bodies."

CONFESSES HE HAS 'DOUBLE-CROSSED' NOT FOE OF LIFE

Notorious McGovern Fake Is Admitted by Joe Gans, Who Swears to Be Square.

Journal Special Service. Chicago, Jan. 25.—Joe Gans, claimant of the lightweight and welterweight pugilistic championships, says he is going to reform. The reason for these happenings was that whenever I wanted to get on with any good fighter my manager would say: 'Joe, the best fighters won't meet you because you are colored. If you want to make any money you will have to lose to the best of them and whip the dubs.'"

Has Troubles at Home. "Nelson's claim that he is the champion lightweight is not founded on fact. He has never won a lightweight championship fight from Britt when we fought for the championship, so he cannot claim that Britt was a champion. I am a fighter and I will fight on the level with any man who is willing to fight on the level with me."
