Railroads

ROADS WILL BE GOOD. Trans-continental Lines Will Refrain from Speed Tests.

Trans-continental lines from Chicago to the coast have agreed to make a schedule which all trains can meet, instead of being late at terminals. They agree also not to start a speed war for inducing the award of the spring mail contracts. The Santa Fe's California Limited, the Rock Island's Golden State Limited and the Los Angeles Limited of the North-Western Union Pacific and San Pedro lines, will increase their running time between Chicago and Los Angeles from 67¼ hours to 69¼ hours.

NEW PLANS FOR HARRIMAN. With Foster and Ripley in Agreement as to Pacific Coast.

San Francisco, Feb. 7.—E. H. Harriman, A. W. Foster and E. P. Ripley of the Santa Fe railway have, it is said, agreed upon a general plan for railroad extension into the northern territory. A new company is being organized, according to report, which is to do three things: first, to take over Ripley's San Francisco & Northwestern line with its valuable Eureka terminals; second, to take over Harriman and Foster's California & Northwestern line between Willits and Tiburon and this city; and probably the North Shore or Sausalito road; third, to build the 100-mile gap north of Willits to the southern end of Ripley's

San Francisco & Northwestern road, thirty-one miles south of Eureka.

The proposed new company will then, it is said, form the nucleus of a north-western California system, which will eventually go up along the coast into Oregon and finally reach Portland, thus forming two trunk lines between Los Angeles and Portland, with San Francisco as their great central point.

The immediate object of Messrs. Harriman, Foster and Ripley in wanting a joint rail line to Eureka, it is said, is to tap the great redwood forest district in Humboldt county and build up a big lumber traffic with the east.

Will Cross Milwaukee Line.

The new line of the Colorado & Southern from Orin Junction, Wyo. to a connection with the Canadian Pacific in Assiniboia, will cross the proposed new Milwaukee coast line, in Montana, forming a connection with that system.

Becomes General Manager.

E. A. Handy, chief engineer and assistant general manager of the Lake Shore & Michigan Southern railway, will succeed W. H. Marshall, general manager, who has been elected president of the American Locomotive company to succeed W. H. Pitkin, deceased.

Pays Conscience Money.

C. E. Stone, general passenger agent of the Great Northern railway, received \$5 conscience money yesterday from a man who said he had once ridden on a pass when he was not entitled to do so. The sender wished to make recompense.

It is understood that altogether the peace negotiations cost the Japanese government \$400,000.

NEEDS INSTRUMENT FOR UNPLAYED NOTES

Florilla Sanford, the pretty girl who is playing the cornet at the Unique this week, as well as the xylophone and four other instruments, is longing for a new musical contrivance. She says that human ingenuity hasn't half applied itself to inventing instruments capable of furnishing "a concord of sweet sounds," and that there are many melodious notes that no known instrument can produce.

Miss Sanford plays an odd instrument which she calls a fagotet. She never encountered but two of these instruments on the stage, one used in her own performances and the other

employed in a burlesque stunt by a man who couldn't play it. Miss Sanford's fagotet makes a noise like a "piece of more so." It is a shrill, high-noted instrument, difficult to play, but Miss Sanford manages to extract some delicious notes from it.

"I never play my fagotet without wishing for a better instrument," she said. "The piano, the violin—no, they won't serve. There are sounds which no instrument yet devised can produce. Let me explain what I mean. Take the effect I am trying to describe. Again, in the blending of tones of certain instruments, there are wonderful melodies suggested. I know I am in deep talking this way, but it is my hobby."

Miss Sanford knows Minneapolis well. She has often played at the state fairs with her father, who conducted "The Japanese Village" for several seasons. She is a soloist of marked ability, having played with Gilmore's band at the St. Louis exposition. Her husband is Burt White, the versatile comedian whose dialect stories constitute one of the hits of the Unique's bill this week.
