## City News

### GREAT COAL FIELDS ALASKAN ASSET

E. E. HALE DECLARES DEPOSITS ARE ALMOST INEXHAUSTIBLE.

Former Minneapolitan, Now Resident of Seward, Alaska, Says Northern Land Will Supply Pacific Coast with Fuel—Warmer in Alaska City Than in Minneapolis.

In another year the entire Pacific coast will be using coal supplied by Alaska.

So says E. E. Hale of Seward, Alaska, formerly a resident of Minneapolis, who is now a guest at the Vendome hotel.

"Work on the construction of the Alaska Central road is being pushed with all speed," said Mr. Hale today. "The line is to extend eventually to Fairbanks, 420 miles from Seward, where construction work has begun. Sixty miles of steel already have been laid. This summer railroad contracts to employ 8,000 to 10,000 men if they can be had. There has been so much successful placer mining in Alaska of late that common labor is hard to come by. The railroad offers \$3 a day wages, and charges \$6 a week for board and camp lodging. The road is even offering to advance passage money to men from San Francisco and Seattle."

"The coal fields are 150 miles from Seward. Another year and the railroad will reach them. The coals are already opened and ready to ship coal as soon as the road can carry it. The coal is a semi-anthracite variety, and has stood very satisfactory tests. There is coal there in quantities that will last for hundreds of years to come."

Will Be Shipped Cheaply.

"Can it be profitably shipped to the states?"

"It can be shipped to the states practically for nothing, for the reason that steamers will carry it instead of ballast. A large vessel will easily take in 1,000 tons of coal ballast on a single trip, and thus carry it to the United States without a cent additional expense."

"I find many of my old friends here in Minneapolis think that because I live in Alaska that I live in a land of perpetual snow and ice. I left Seward Feb. 20, with the sun bright and warm, and no one thinking of wearing an overcoat. This winter the thermometer at one time registered 8 degrees below zero. This is the coldest it has been for some years. The previous winter the coldest was 4 degrees below zero, and that was in the month of June. At Seward we have a milder climate than you have in Minneapolis. The first time I wore my overcoat this winter was the day I arrived in Minneapolis."

Out of an estate of about \$100,000 left by Mrs. A. E. Dalrymple of St. Paul, Mrs. Victor H. Smalley, the only child of the deceased, will receive only \$10,000, and she will not come into that legacy until she is 35 years of age, or twelve years from now.

The small amount left to the daughter comes as a surprise in some quarters, but was not unexpected on account of the parental displeasure over her choice of a husband. The remainder of the estate will be divided among charitable institutions, churches and relatives.

Mrs. Smalley had before been benefited by her father's will to the extent of a two-thirds interest in a \$300,000 estate.
