

MIZNER IS SUED FOR HABERDASHER'S BILL

Husband of Yerkes' Widow as Artful a Dodger as Rockefeller.

New York Herald Special Service. New York, March 10.—Wilson Mizner, who created a sensation in the social world a little more than a month ago by marrying the widow of Charles T. Yerkes, six weeks after the latter's death, has been sued for a bill of \$378, which it is asserted that he owes for furnishings supplied to him.

A 40-STORY SKYSCRAPER THAT WILL BE WONDER OF WORLD

The Singer Building In New York to Tower over Any Structure Built by Man—And There Is Quicksand Beneath the Site!

Nothing more radical has ever been attempted on either side of the ocean than is embodied in the plans for this structure. The building is to be forty stories high—more than twice as tall as the famous Flatiron—

The announcement of the purpose to put up the Singer building comes as a surprise to architects and builders. It was supposed the limit had been reached in this style of structure, but it seems not. Before long a fifty-story pile may be expected to make slow-going people gasp.

It will probably take two years to build this remarkable structure. The present intention is to begin work within three months. As skyscraper costs go the Singer building will not be a record-breaker.

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
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In this as in other large buildings the bed upon which this enormous mass of steel and stone must rest is a matter for careful calculation and most delicate engineering skill. Foundation and cellars sixty and eighty feet deep were unknown to the last generation, yet that unknown factor is now a constant factor in every great building equation of the present day.

On Manhattan island it is necessary to go thru a layer of quicksand, anywhere from one foot to fifty feet in thickness, before solid rock is found for foundation. To dig a foundation thru it is almost equivalent to bailing out a leaky boat.

This situation requires the exercising of the greatest engineering skill and caution, for there are buildings on both sides of the excavation and these must be prevented from falling into the pit.
