SENATORS' WRATH FIRED BY CANNON

Speaker of the House Treats Senate to Dose of Its Own Medicine.

BLOCKADE CHARGES ASTUTELY DENIED

Some Sore Statesmen Say He Holds Up Bills of Foes of House Measures.

Washington, March 15.—"Uncle Joe" Cannon is giving the senate a dose of its own medicine, heger and dismay. To the anger and dismay of the upper house, he is blocking the passage of bills in which senators personally are interested.

The senate has exercised and can exercise, its prerogative of amending or amending out of all shape bills of great national importance sent to it by the house, but this speaker, is beginning to show it, too, can play at this game, and with measures which are directly the creations of senators and their constituents.

Several senators declare the policy speaker Cannon has adopted is of such a high-handed character as to call for the sharpest comment.

Today while his wife was in the bathroom, Nossier turned the key, and disregarding her protestations to be let out he went to Miss Reynolds' room.

WOOD EXPLAINS MORO SLAUGHTER

General Wood's Explanation.

General Wood's dispatch says: "The military secretary, Washington: In answer to the secretary of war's request for information March 12, I present herewith practically entire action and inspected top of crater after action was finished.

President's Comment. Secretary Taft sent this message to President Roosevelt and received a reply containing the following:

This answer is, of course, entirely satisfactory. The officers and enlisted men under General Wood's command have performed a most gallant and soldierly feat in a way that confers added credit on the American army.

MITCHELL HOPEFUL
