## KERST INQUIRES INTO ITASCA COUNTY CASE

Public Examiner P. M. Kerst is in Grand Rapids today, attending a meeting of the commissioners of Itasca county. Unless the commissioners follow his directions in collecting the shortage of a former county treasurer, C. C. Miller, the matter will be taken out of their hands entirely.

Miller went out of office in January, 1905, and was found to be short a considerable sum. It is now estimated at about \$8,000, but is fully covered by a surety bond for \$50,000. H. M. Temple, a St. Paul accountant, was engaged a year ago to investigate the books.

One or more men worked steadily at an expense to the county of about \$2,000, until Jan. 16 of this year, when the county commissioners by a vote of three to two stopped the investigation. No demand has been made on the bond company for the shortage, as there is no way of reaching the exact amount.

Mr. Kerst has taken the matter into his own hands. It is understood that if the commissioners do not follow up the matter and collect from the bond company, he will assume charge of the investigation, and will also prefer charges against the commissioners for failure to perform their official duty.
