MURDOCH PLEADS FOR FREE ALCOHOL

Representative Predicts Revolution in Power and Illuminants with Tax Removed.

Washington, April 6.—With other business out of the way, Representative Murdoch rose to champion the so-called free alcohol bill.

Will Work Revolution.
Mr. Murdoch made the assertion that if the tax is taken off denatured alcohol, it will work a revolution in the field of fuel, power and illuminants. He said:

"This will be accomplished partially thru known methods, but a greater development will come thru methods to be discovered, for there is no industrial avenue closed to the open sea. American genius has known methods the same volume of alcohol burns nearly twice as long as kerosene and gives a far better light; it is a cleaner safe fuel than gasoline.

"By methods that are to come, I believe that alcohol will advance far beyond its present superiority. I believe this because this country, the chief producer of corn which is the best source of alcohol, has for nearly fifty years held industrial alcohol in leash.

"In those fifty years all other chemical products and fuels and illuminants have been free. Burnable alcohol, for industrial use, has been held back. Let it loose it, let American genius have hold of it, and it will open the door to a chamber of marvels.

Would Combat Oil Trust.

"The most important effect of removing the tax on denatured alcohol would be its regulation of the present erratic price of kerosene and gasoline. Gasoline sells in some of the eastern cities at 3 cents a gallon and in some of the western states at 30 cents a gallon. Kerosene has a similar range. The price of both is arbitrarily fixed.

"Actual tests have demonstrated that alcohol at 30c a gallon is cheaper for light than kerosene at 15 cents a gallon. Twenty-cent alcohol would drive 10-cent kerosene down in price or out of the market. For internal combustion engines 20-cent alcohol would bring 80-cent gasoline down to 20 cents, and would in time supplant it perhaps, because gasoline, of which petroleum yields but 2 per cent, is increasing in price, because of its increased use in engines.

Is Adaptable Everywhere.

"The internal combustion engine is making a conquering march thru the land. Light in weight, small in size, easy to start, requiring a minimum of attendance while in operation, it is everywhere bringing new economies. It is turning the weekly newspaper press, the town feed mills, the bath of the local elevator, and in some sections it bales the farmer's hay, shells his corn, shreds the fodder, pumps the water, separates the cream, saws the wood.

"With the tax removed from denatured alcohol, the use of the internal combustion engine will increase by leaps and bounds. Experts estimate that the output will reach 100,000 alcohol engines a year.

"In 1860 this country produced 90,000,000 gallons of alcohol. This was before the tax went on. David A. Wells, a special commissioner, reported to the fifty-third congress that in his opinion 33 per cent of the whole product, prior to the imposition of any taxes on alcohol, was consumed in the arts and industries. Consequently with a population of 30,000,000 in 1860 we used industrially and for fuel and light 30,000,000 gallons, that is one gallon of alcohol per capita.

"Leaving out of consideration the great inventions which have come since 1860, other new uses and improved methods, the same proportion would bring our use of denatured alcohol today up to 75,000,000 gallons annually. It will be far greater than that."

SUSPECTED MURDERER OF WEILER ARRESTED

Winnipeg, Man., April 6.—Word was received at the attorney general's department here today that Martin Doyle, Sr., hotel proprietor at Dresden, N. D., had been arrested at Battleford, Sask., last night, charged with the murder of Vincent Weiler of Mount Carmel, N. D., whose dead body was found with the throat cut and a bullet hole in the head, in the woods a few miles from Snowflake, Man., a few days ago.

It is alleged that Doyle and Weiler entered into some agreement whereby Weiler was to sell his farm to Doyle. It is claimed that Weiler was last seen in company with Doyle on Nov. 18, 1905, going in the direction of the place where the body was found. The Manitoba authorities will send an officer to Battleford tonight to bring Doyle to Snowflake, where he will be held for a preliminary hearing.

MAY REJECT REDSKIN

HERRIOTT IN THE RACE

Lieutenant Governor of Iowa Is Out for First Place.

Council Bluffs, Iowa, April 6.—John Herriott of Stuart, lieutenant governor of Iowa, and a former state treasurer, will today announce himself as a candidate for the republican nomination for governor. A heated contest has been waged by Governor Cummins and former Congressman George D. Perkins of Sioux City, and Mr. Herriott says his action is in the interest of party harmony. He is a newspaper man.

Mr. Herriott asks for the nomination on a "stand-up" platform. In an address to Iowa republicans, published this morning, he declares himself opposed to radical tariff revision. He favors railroad rate regulation and a moderate primary election law.
