and in their day were immensely popular. His best works rank with those of Bjornson, Ibsen and Jonas Lie.

Born in Stavanger, of good family, Alexander Lange Kjelland prepared for the university and after graduation took up the study of law. He never practiced, however, but went into business as a manufacturer of tile.

In 1878 a series of short stories was published anonymously. They attracted much attention and Bjornson urged the newly discovered author to devote himself to literature.

Among his better-known works are "Garman and Worse," "Elsie," and "Skipper Worse." His latest great work was "Jakob," which the author himself admitted was inferior to his former productions.

In 1891 he was elected mayor of Stavanger, and the next year was appointed "amtmand" for Romsdal. In this position he distinguished himself by his ability and energy as an official.

It cannot be said that he was particularly popular as a functionary, for he developed the same traits which he had so caustically criticized in his writings. Nevertheless he was most capable and of spotless integrity.

All efforts to induce Kjelland to take up the pen again failed until last fall, when his book on Napoleon appeared. This failed to realize the expectations of his friends.

SHAKSPEREAN TRAGEDY Finding of a Folio Edition Results in Divorce Suit in Sweden.

William Shakspeare is indirectly the cause of a unique divorce proceeding in Sweden. Last year Mr. Kraft found an old edition of Shakspeare in Malmö. It was dated 1594, and the finder concluded that it must be of considerable value.


