PRESIDENT TO CUT BIG FIGURE IN '08

Inheritance Tax Utterance and Covert Suggestions May Cause Denial of Retirement.

By W. W. Jermans. Washington, April 18.—The president's statement in favor of an inheritance tax in his speech last Saturday continues to be the leading subject of conversation among politicians in both the great parties here. Said one of them today: "A few more utterances of that kind and it will be useless to continue to believe that the president is not to cut a tremendous figure in 1908."

The president's declaration has chilled the atmosphere in the vicinity of nearly all of the republican presidential aspirants. The president is not a candidate for another term, and has said he would not accept again. But what might happen to the president's position if the people were solidly to array themselves against it? That is the question just now concerning politicians most.

Democrats Take Credit. How the inheritance tax proposition has soured in the ears of the politicians is indicated by what a certain republican senator said to another republican senator this morning while discussing the address:

"Another democratic plank stolen," were his words, and to this all hands readily agreed.

Of course, such a radical proposal has excited a great variety of comment. Democrats in general have pointed out that the president is edging up close to their income-tax doctrine. Their most serious criticism of his suggestion is that it is not so good as the income tax. But so far as it goes they generally like it.

Eastern republicans express conviction that it is very dangerous, and so do some others. But apparently, judging by the aggregate of suggestions thus far heard, the president would be able to carry his party with him.

Rate Regulation Only Start. Yet this, the most striking thing by way of proposed innovation, was not nearly all of it that was contained in the "Waukegan" speech. The president indicated his opinion that the rate legislation of this session is a "beginning" toward that class of reforms.

He doesn't assume that a transportation millenium is to be precipitated by the enactment of the Hepburn bill. In this he is fully agreed with the great majority of advocates of regulation. They thing the Hepburn bill only a step.

What the next step is that the president has in mind can only be guessed. Representative Martin, with his federal licensing proposition, and his Newlands, with his proposal of federal incorporation of interstate railroads, are both able to find most satisfying evidence in the speech that the president sympathizes with their views. In fact, the two proposals are so different in essence; it is rather a difference in degree.

May Insist on Roosevelt. But, as these are to show what the president wants public thought directed in, it is plain that if the series of new issues that the president has suggested is to be made, a definite legislative program, or the basis of one, that program cannot be carried out until after a presidential election. The next house will be closer; partisan feeling will be stronger; unanimous action, such as the rate bill has brought at this session, will be unlikely.

Big legislative business will have to go over till after the next presidential election, in all likelihood. And if there comes a presidential election while such a set of issues is pending, what more natural than that the people insist that the man who proposed them continue as leader till they be enacted.

That is the reasoning of some politicians. There are others who see it a little differently. These declare that the president has merely supplied some talking ground while his party's speakers may occupy the coming congressional campaign. It will help them avoid the tariff; it will be radical enough to suit the radical; it will rob the democrats of the claim to being the only folks with the interests of the plain people at heart. This is the aspect which, perhaps more than any other, appeals to republican congressmen who have troubles at home.

MOST ACTIVE PERIOD THE CITY HAS EVER KNOWN.
