DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND LABOR PREPARES REPORT. Government Applies to Labor Organizations for Information on All Kinds of Co-operative or Other Insurance—Blanks Provided for Full Answers to Questions Bearing on Subject.

Statistics are being sought by Commissioner Charles P. Neill of the department of commerce and labor, who is preparing a report on workmen's insurance in the United States.
