# ALL LEGISLATURE CALLED BY JURY

Massachusetts Solons Answer Charges of Wholesale Graft—Lawson at Bottom.

Boston, Mass., May 10.—Every member of the state legislature of Massachusetts has been summoned to appear before the Suffolk county grand jury and answer charges of wholesale graft in the passage and defeat of legislative measures.

In batches of seventy-five, the 240 members of the house and forty members of the senate will pass in review before the inquirers. This procedure will be followed each day until every legislator has answered questions prepared by District Attorney John B. Moran.

This graft investigation began today, and is the first on record involving the entire legislature of a state. Announcement of it produced a sensation by the grand jury.

**Lawson Back of It.**  
District Attorney Moran is responsible for the investigation and Thomas W. Lawson is responsible for Moran's unprecedented action.

In a recent public announcement Lawson declared that seventy members of the legislature had been guilty of accepting or offering bribes. In a long interview with the grand jury yesterday, he is believed to have made the disclosures which prompted Moran to demand so sweeping an investigation by the grand jury.

In his examination of the legislators, the grand jury will sift every matter that has been before the present legislature to which a suspicion of corruption has been attached. It will require the overtime bill, the bucket-shop bill and several other bills will be inquired into to discover whether or not improper methods were employed to pass or defeat any of them.

**Solons Must Appear.**  
The legislators have been served with a legal summons from the grand jury—not a personal request by Mr. Moran—so they will be compelled to put in an appearance. The process-server from the office of District Attorney Moran arrived at the statehouse yesterday afternoon while the house was in recess. They had not the least difficulty in serving the summonses which require the presence of witnesses before the grand jury at 9 a.m. today in the case of the commonwealth against Richard Roe et al.

This development in the legislative scandal that has so excited the state follows the discovery that a fund of \$70,000 was raised by the bucket-shop proprietors of Massachusetts to be used in the defeat of hostile legislation. It was contributed by bucket-shop men in cities and towns thru the state. Much of the fund already has been expended.

**Green Lobbyists Made Mess.**  
It has been said by those on the "inside" at the statehouse that the disposition of the corruption fund was placed in the hands of amateurs, green lobbyists, and that they made a mess of it. To this is due, to a large extent, the publicity of the scandal which shadows the house of representatives. It is commonly reported on Beacon hill that about forty members of the house and senate have been influenced by this lobby.

Another action to be looked into is the surprising defeat of the overtime bill, a labor measure, also restricting child labor in the textile mills. This bill seemed sure to pass, but was killed at the last moment, enough members suddenly shifting their attitude and vote.

# BOY'S TONGUE IS CUT OFF TO SAVE HIS LIFE

Millville, N. J., May 10.—Albert Travis was playing about the Millville ice plant yesterday, when a companion dared him to touch one of the frost pipes with his tongue.

"I never take a dare," he said, and, walking over to the white pipe, touched it with his tongue.

In a moment he was writhing in pain, while his companions stood about and laughed, thinking him a hardy fellow. He was terribly swollen and was frozen fast to the pipe.

All efforts to release him from his serious predicament were futile and his father was summoned. Learning that there was no other way to save his son, he spoke to the engineer and turned away while the man opened a sharp blade of his pocket knife and cut off the lad's tongue. Before Dr. Wheeler's force could arrive to see the scene the boy had almost bled to death. He is now in a very serious condition.

# POLICE FIND PLUNDER OF 'MASONIC BURGLAR'

New York, May 10.—In Burnett Konigsberg's innocent-looking little jewelry shop on Second avenue, Central office detectives today discovered a thief's den, where William Metelski, the "Masonic burglar" disclosed his plunder.

They arrested Konigsberg, who tried to escape at the pistol's point. They found hidden in the shop many thousands of dollars' worth of silverware, watches and jewelry. They estimate that they will finally recover \$50,000 worth of loot. Already twenty-one persons have identified part of the stolen goods as theirs.

Metelski was put in a cell at police headquarters with James L. Whalley, the convivia contractor. The detectives hid in the next cell and Metelski and Whalley began to tell their woe to each other. Metelski boastfully told of having posed as a Mason when he robbed George E. Gale's house in Brooklyn.

"You'll get out in the morning," Metelski told him. "You jump over to Konigsberg's jewelry store and tell him I'm jugged, and that he must get me bondsman. Tell him, too, he must get rid of the stuff before the police search the shop."

With this clue the police located the alleged fence.
