MILLIONAIRE INSANE; HIS ESTATE DISPOSED OF. Journal Special Service. Worcester, Mass., May 18.—Distribution of the \$5,000,000 estate of Rowson C. Taylor, a familiar figure in the streets of Worcester and at the present time esteemed as one of the city's most prominent citizens, has brought to light the fact that he has been declared insane. Judge Forbes has appointed Charles L. Thayer and E. L. Morgan guardians and ordered a division of the estate. It will be distributed as if Mr. Taylor had died. It now appears that in deciding the insanity question there was weighed in the balance the old man's ability to tell who is president of the United States. When Mr. Taylor did not name Theodore Roosevelt he was adjudged insane. RIGO SCORNS CHIMAY; SAYS SHE WANTS HIM.
