Minnesota still leads the United States in the production of northern pine, and on total lumber production of all varieties of woods stands well up with the leaders, ranking fourth. On total production of lumber three states—Minnesota, Louisiana and Wisconsin—are slightly ahead of Minnesota.

These results are shown by the first report of the government forest service, made public last week at the meeting of the National Lumber Manufacturers' association in St. Louis. The report is full of interest to lumbermen in Minnesota and throughout the country. It is the first comprehensive report of the government as a part of the forest service. At present only lumber production is included, but in another year or two the service hopes to be able to report also on available supplies in every part of the country.

The government forestry agents have covered the United States, visiting and corresponding with the lumber merchants of every locality. The 1905 report is based on statistics from 11,649 firms, representing from 65 to 75 per cent of the lumber-producing concerns of the country. The total lumber cut of the United States in 1905 is reported at 27,887,000,000 feet. Minnesota stands fourth on the list of lumber-producing states, with reports from 173 firms showing a total cut of 1,718,000,000 feet. It leads in the production of northern pine with 1,648,000,000 feet.

The other lumber with which Minnesota is credited, and the cut of each, is as follows: Hemlock, 24; spruce, 4; cedar, 1; tamarack, 11; white oak, 3; red oak, 2; maple, 3; ash, 2; elm, 5; basswood, 7; birch, 4; mixed, 7. Lumbermen realize the value of these statistics and are planning to offer every possible assistance in their collection. Of special value will be the further report concerning timber still standing and the acreage of each locality and of each kind of wood. Timber tracts are being rapidly depleted and it will be important to know what there is in sight for the closing years of the present lumber industry.

Lumbermen generally are also interested in the campaign that has been undertaken to allow free carstages and holding timbers from the railroad companies. For years lumbermen have been shipping lumber on flat-cars and have been compelled to furnish the freight and attend to securing them, also an item that in aggregate, amounts to a great deal for a large concern. As the railroad companies furnish special cars for some of the freight and attend to securing others that are carried on flat-cars, the lumbermen maintain that they are entitled to such as much. Action has been taken before the interstate commerce commission to compel the railroads to furnish carstages and other holders free of charge and free of freight. Not caring to have the matter carried too far, the railroads have voluntarily made an allowance of 500 pounds for the freight on the stakes, hoping thereby to head off the movement. The 500-pound allowance has been gratefully received, but the fight for the rest of the lumbermen's demands is still to be pushed.

Michael Monson, 70 years old, an employee of the North Star Woolen Mill company, was yesterday killed by a passenger train at Seventh avenue S and Second street at 6 o'clock last evening while he was going from work to his home at 1512 Second street S.

The aged man left the factory as usual and took the same route home that he had taken for more than thirty years. Trains were passing both ways and he stepped off the train when the Soo passenger train approached, and he attempted to cross directly in front of it. He was struck squarely in the side and thrown to one side of the tracks.

Several of his fellow workmen saw the accident and rushed to him, but he died just as they reached him. The train that struck him pulled into the Milwaukee station where the engineer had a physician summoned and ordered the police ambulance. They could be of no aid, however, and the body was taken to the city hospital. It was claimed later in the evening by Louis Monson, 2412 Fourteenth avenue S, the only son of the aged man. Coroner Kistler decided that death was due to accident and no autopsy or inquest will be held.
