City News

FOUR SMALL PARKS MERGED INTO ONE

MAGNIFICENT SCHEME WILL BE PUT INTO EFFECT.

Park Commissioners Approve Plan to Consolidate St. Anthony and Riverside Parkways, and Riverside and Minnehaha Parks into One Stretch of Scenic Beauty—River Helps Idea.

Minneapolis will have an immense park, one that will compare in size with Central park in New York city and other famous parks, and surpass most of them in scenic beauty. The plan was submitted to the park commissioners at their meeting yesterday, and obtained enthusiastic approval. The most gratifying feature of the plan is that it will not entail any expense. The proposition is a most simple one, only to consolidate the parks and parkways along the Mississippi river into one vast park tract. This they virtually are now, but the fact seems not to have occurred to any one before.

How Plan Works.
Commissioner W. F. Decker suggested the consolidation and his scheme secured instant approval. He called attention to the fact that Riverside park, St. Anthony parkway, Riverside parkway, and Minnehaha park were virtually one, but had been given different names probably from the fact that the land was acquired at different times. The fact that the river flowed between did not necessarily make different parks as it was in order to have a stream of flowing water in such a tract.

Minnehaha park has an area of 138.94 acres; Riverside parkway, 175.64 acres; St. Anthony parkway, 80.5 acres; Riverside park, 19.78 acres, and the river bank area, 10.12 acres, a grand total of 700 acres, or almost as much as Central park, New York. Moreover, the Mississippi river, by the construction of government dams, would be converted into a parkway, bounded by two bridges at Franklin avenue and Lake street, which join the two sides.

Mr. Dexter suggested that the tract be christened Mississippi park, but the present local name was called for and the matter be referred to a committee for further consideration, and this was done.

Goodby Hennepin.
The board took final leave of Hennepin and Lyndale avenues by turning over \$1,200 to the city council for the maintenance of these former parkways as traffic streets. There was some objection to this plan from the residents along Hennepin avenue, on the ground that the supreme court had not passed on the legal questions involved in the vacation of the streets. The park board, however, was called to attention to the fact that the district court had refused to make an order to compel the board to resume its care of the streets and that the board had no jurisdiction. The money was voted and will be distributed as follows: Third ward, \$500; fourth ward, \$240; eighth ward, \$346; tenth ward, \$96.

Accepts New Park.
Tower hill in Prospect park was designated as a park. The expense will be \$10,000, including interest on the certificates of indebtedness. This amount will be assessed against the real estate in that section of the city, it being agreed that the assessments shall not extend west of Twenty-seventh avenue SE, or beyond the railway severally. The agreement is that the Prospect park objected to the plan on the ground that the cost of the land was excessive, but a majority of the delegation urged the park board to proceed and the plan was adopted unanimously.

Colonel F. M. Joyce of the Automobile club presented the matter of holding a series of races during the Grand Army encampment, and urged the cooperation of the board. The matter was referred to the committee on privileges.

Superintendent Theodore Wirth recommended various minor improvements, such as incandescent gasoline lights in Van Cleve park, and an artesian well in Murphy square, and these were referred to the committee on improvements.

Hanker for Music.
W. C. Edgar, on behalf of a number of citizens, petitioned the board to provide a band stand at the Parade for open-air concerts for military bands. The agreement is that the funds for the concerts be raised by popular subscription, Thursday evening is suggested as a desirable one for such concerts.

The awards for the land condemned for park purposes between the Parade and Loring park were confirmed, notwithstanding the objections of three property owners, who are not satisfied with the amounts awarded them.

The matter of removing Kistler's store at Sixth and Lyndale avenues N. was referred to the committee on improvements with power to act. Dr. Kistler will cut off enough of the house to enable the building to be moved up Lyndale avenue without doing any damage to the shade trees along the street.
