

STUDENTS LISTEN TO SOUND ADVICE

FAREWELL ADDRESSES GIVEN AT SCHOOLS AND COLLEGES.

Commencement week at Hamline and Macalester with scholarly sermons to graduates—Four Minneapolis High School Classes Attend Formal Services Held for Them.

Commencement week at Hamline university opened yesterday with the customary divine services at the chapel, which were filled to the utmost. In the places of honor sat the members of the graduating class, forty-five in number. The baccalaureate sermon was preached by Dr. Fayette L. Thompson of the Hennepin Avenue church, Minneapolis. His theme, "The Giant's Sword," was based on the defeat of Goliath by David. As David had captured a sword, which was a captured weapon, the graduate had captured a weapon with which they could win the victories of life.

Dr. James Wallace, president of Macalester college, preached the baccalaureate sermon to the graduating class of the institution yesterday. The exercises were held in the chapel, which was profusely decorated with flowers and foliage. Dr. Wallace sought to impress upon the graduates the vision of Joseph. The pulpit was screened behind a bank of palms, foliage and flowers and in the rear the class colors of orange and green were becomingly draped. Dr. Guild spoke at some length on the advantages of a common school education, which enabled the children of poor people to make a start in life on a more equal footing with those who had other advantages. The visions of youth may not always be realized, he said, but with intelligence and diligence substantial success may be achieved.

South High School. The graduates of the South high school heard their baccalaureate sermon at the Tabernacle yesterday. The Rev. G. H. Gamble spoke to them on "The Master Mind." The interior of the church was prettily decorated with the stars and stripes and the school and class colors. Mr. Gamble dwelt on the thought that true success is gained thru sacrifice. The master mind does not seek honor, but "serves"; and its worth is expressed in service, which exalts it to a deserving place.

North High School. Dr. R. Riley of the First Baptist church conducted the commencement service for the graduates of the North high school. Fifty members of the class occupied the central portion of the auditorium. The musical services were by the church choir. Dr. Riley spoke impressively of the responsibilities of the new life which is facing the young people and exhorted them to noble thoughts and deeds.

East High School. In lieu of a baccalaureate sermon, the graduates of the East High school listened yesterday to an address by W. F. Webster, principal of the school, who spoke on "Sacrifice," from the Bible. "Whoever loveth his life shall save it," The exercise was held at the First Congregational church, which was filled to the utmost. Mr. Webster ridiculed the oft-quoted expression, "The world owes anyone a living. The world is fairly just, he declared, and pays for what it gets and rarely in advance. The mad race for wealth, inspired by selfish greed, was deplored. The value of a college education was set forth in the most earnest manner.
