

AMUSEMENT AND RECREATION ARE ALWAYS AVAILABLE IN MINNEAPOLIS, ESPECIALLY FAVORED IN ITS RESORTS

No Matter What the Mood of the Seeker After Rest or Pleasure, the Varied Opportunities Offered by Minneapolis Resorts Will Meet the Requirements of the Case--No Other City So Well Situated with Regard to Attractive Places for Summer Amusement.

NO CITY in the country is more fortunately situated than Minneapolis for attractive and wholesome amusement places in summer. Nature has been most generous in making Minneapolis an ideal city for the person in search of pleasant nooks and resting places or amusement resorts. There are lakes and waterfalls on every side, and all within a short ride of the heart of the city.

The Pleasures of Minnetonka.

Minneapolis is especially fortunate in having the most beautiful lake in Minnesota, Lake Minnetonka. This famous lake is regarded as the most beautiful inland body of water in the country. With its 115 miles of shore, its magnificent woods, its fields of wild flowers, its gleaming water lilies mirrored in the placid water, there is hardly a spot that is not a worthy subject for the painter's brush. No matter which way one turns new beauties attract the eye and delight the artistic soul.

Along its shores are country estates with palatial villas, upon which thousands of dollars have been expended, and little log huts in their most primitive simplicity nestle among the stately oaks, making continued and varied scenic effects.

Even to the old lake dweller the lake is full of surprises, and to the visitor

it is an unending delight with its multitude of channels and inlets, the irregularities of its shore line showing unexpected vistas of the blue water, the countless bays and the beautifully wooded islands.

The lower lake is especially beautiful, and the great body of water received the name of the "broad water" from the Sioux Indians, who first saw its broad expanse. Going thru the narrows to the romantic upper lake is one of the most beautiful parts of the tour of forty miles the boats make daily.

There are a number of good hotels and summer boarding houses, and long summer days are filled with gaiety and pleasure. There are numerous concerts, excursions, roller skating, yachting and excellent fishing to attract the visitor.

Wonderland Amusement Park.

Twin City Wonderland is an amusement resort situated within easy reach, with a nominal price of admission. Its diversions and recreation keep the people in the open air and give them relaxation and entertainment during the summer months.

It is not a picnic ground, but a park with broad promenades lined by buildings of tasteful architectural appearance, in which attractions of a novel character are presented--there are no sideshows, freaks or fakes.

A scenic railway races you over an undulating track in and out of a scenic tunnel; the chutes give you a swift boat-ride down an incline and across a lagoon; the old mill furnishes boat-rides along a canal of scenic illusions; an airship whirls you high in the air, and a carousel gives you a similar ride of a milder character nearer the grounds. These and other amusement devices are just sensational enough to be exciting and stir the blood.

The Johnstons flood furnishes an impressive panoramic spectacle, the infant incubators teach a chapter in the lesson of life that is deeply interesting to the lover of humanity. There are a dozen or more "fun factories"--the third degree, house of nonsense, Arcadia, mystic world, laughing gallery--all intended to make you laugh. There are curious games of skill, fortune tellers' booths, photographic galleries, a rifle range--simple diversions, but all innocent and diverting. For the children especially there is a big merry-go-round, a miniature locomotive and slide toboggan, etc.

At night 40,000 electric lights, arranged in striking designs, furnish an illumination that is beautiful. People walk about or rest on benches while they watch the crowds or listen to band concerts. Aerial and acrobatic acts are presented, which are free to all. These attractions are changed weekly, and fireworks spectacles are added. There is a dancing pavilion, too, refreshment stands and many other minor features.

This is what Wonderland is "like." It is open from 10 o'clock in the afternoon to 11 o'clock at night, continuously. You can go there at any time, spend what you like, stay as long as you wish. Wonderland is always orderly and ladies and children are safe from annoyances incident to some other resorts.

similar to one at the White City, Chicago, which has been one of the features of amusement of that popular resort. The attraction represents a country town on fire and its spectacular effects are thrilling. Over 200 persons will take part in the performance and it promises to be one of the popular attractions of the season.

The recent heavy rains have flooded the grounds and so the opening will be retarded a few days. This week the streetcar service will be greatly improved and cars will leave St. Paul every fifteen minutes.

The large picnic grounds make it a favorite resort for the picnickers of both cities and the boating, coasting and various amusements add to the pleasure.

Phalen Park.

One of St. Paul's most popular resorts is Phalen park, which includes 400 acres of beautifully wooded land stretching along Lake Phalen, three and one-half miles. Every day finds from 4,000 to 7,000 visitors enjoying its natural beauties, and from 20,000 to 25,000 seek the cooling shades on hot Sundays. The picnic grounds are large and well arranged, and during the heated season an empty table is rarely seen so great is the crowd.

The admission to the park and grounds is free and there are many attractions to which the admittance is merely nominal.

There is a handsome pavilion costing \$14,000 where refreshments of all kinds are served and where daily concerts are held.

Sunday the Daily News band is one of the attractions and good music is always provided.

The number and class of its attractions Phalen park resembles Minneapolis' Wonderland. There are two miniature railways, an airship, a House of Trouble, the Mystic Swing, Tours of Both Land and Sea and some half dozen other attractions both amusing and interesting.

The car service is ample to handle the thousands of visitors and the park is well worth a visit to one looking for pleasure and enjoyment or a quiet rest

Famous Minnehaha.

"One sees Minnehaha, gleaming, glowing thru the bushes.

As one hears the Laughing Water.

From behind its screen of branches was never so true as now, for not even the oldest settler can remember when the falls have been so beautiful.

The water is five inches higher than it has been for a century, and in rushing volume over the ledge and as it reaches the rocks below rising in a spray that reaches to the walks above and to the rustic bridge crossing the creek far below.

A stroll down the picturesque and romantic glen would thrill even the most unimaginative, for everything breathes fragrance, wild flowers fill the air with their sweetness, there is the delicious odor of ferns and moss, and the birds sing with full-throated joy.


