

PILLSBURY ATHLETES SHOWED AT CHICAGO

Jones First Home in 880-Yard Run at Interscholastic Meet.

Chicago, June 9.—For the fourth successive time, Lewis Institute squad of athletes today carried away the banner emblematic of the championship of the University of Chicago's interscholastic games.

In the fifth renewal of the event on Marshall field Lewis gathered a total of twenty-three points, defeating by good margins the two Detroit schools, its closest competitors.

To Ida Grove, Iowa, and Joliet, Ill., fell the honors of setting new United States interscholastic marks, which, with the cracking of all but two or three of the maroon interscholastic records, made the meet easily the most remarkable one ever held under the auspices of the midway school.

Griffin of Joliet hurled the discs 122 feet 4 1/2 inches. The best previous record was 117 feet 2 1/2 inches, made by himself in the University of Illinois games this year.

Detroit university school got a total of 17 1/2 points, which put it in second place easily, and Detroit Central High gathered 14 1/2. Talbot of Kansas City Manual Training High gave a good account of himself in the twelve-pound hammer throw, setting a mark of 185 feet 3/4 inches.

In breaking the United States interscholastic record in the two-mile run, Griffin of Joliet set a mark that probably will stand for a long time unless he cracks it himself.

The second race of the 440-yard run brought out a remarkable contest, in which J. C. Evans of the Northwestern college propounded a new record.


