
St. Paul Property Owners Take Hold in University Avenue Job.

Aged Physician Who Died Friday Night One of the Last of the Old-School Doctors.



In his interesting book of personal reminiscences Dr. Wakeman told of the days when calls were made on horseback and the physician was called upon to pull teeth and perform other dental work.

For sixty-five years Dr. Wakeman was engaged in the practice of medicine. The first twenty, with an intermission for a postgraduate course at Hahnemann college, Philadelphia, was spent in Portsmouth, Ohio.

Born in Hector, Hopkins county, New York, Dr. Wakeman went to Ohio at an early age and received his first medical training at a small college in Worthington, near Columbus.
