

PATTISON IS DEAD; HARRIS GOVERNOR

Ohio's Executive Passes Suddenly to Rest—Republican Lieutenant Succeeds Him.

Cincinnati, June 19.—John M. Pattison, governor of Ohio, died of Bright's disease last evening at his home in Milford, fifteen miles east of this city...

On a beautiful hill near his home his body will be laid to rest on Thursday.

Andrew Lintner Harris, lieutenant governor, under the constitution becomes governor for the balance of the term for which Pattison was elected.

The oath of the office was administered to General Harris last night.

General Harris is a republican, Governor Pattison having been the only democrat on the state ticket elected last fall.

Soldier at Sixteen. John M. Pattison, boy soldier, lawyer, state legislator, member of congress and governor of Ohio, was a native of Clermont county, Ohio...

He was admitted to the bar in 1879 and elected to the lower house of the Ohio legislature in 1873. He became a member of the Ohio senate in 1890, and was elected to the fifty-second congress.

For the past fifteen years he has been president of the Union Central Life Insurance company. He was a life-long member of the Methodist Episcopal church.
