BANKER WAS ONCE A LABOR LEADER

W. G. EDENS HAS HAD VARIED EXPERIENCE.

Helped Organize Brakemen's Union in the Early Eighties and Is Now Trying to Build up a Better Understanding Among the Bankers.

W. G. Edens, in charge of the country bank connections of the Central Trust company of Illinois at Chicago, was one of the leading figures at the Minnesota State Bankers' convention at Tonka Bay, Lake Minnetonka. Although still a young man, he has had a varied experience in business and politics, a wide acquaintance with the prominent men of the country. Mr. Edens is familiar with Minneapolis because of his connection with the Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen, and from the fact of his position with the postoffice department in past years brought him here frequently.

In 1878 Mr. Edens entered railroad service at Bucyrus, Ohio, as office boy. While there he assisted in the organization of the brakemen, and became one of the national officers of the order now known as the B. of R. T., of which he is still an active member. From 1888 to 1895 he was organizer. His official position expired when, in 1889, at St. Paul, he was succeeded as assistant grand master by P. H. Morrison, now master of the order.

While in Ohio Mr. Edens became a great friend of McKinley, and when the fight was on in 1896 as to the instruction of the Illinois delegation for McKinley, Edens went against the state organization and won out. He later became organizer of the Illinois Republican league, in 1895-6; and when the national committee organized at Chicago Mr. Edens had confidential relations with Chairman Hanna, and later with Henry Payne and G. B. Cortelyou. In 1897 he was appointed assistant general superintendent of the free delivery system by President McKinley. He resigned two years ago.

Mr. Edens was in the meantime grand chancellor of the Knights of Pythias of Illinois, and now is in the supreme lodge from Illinois.

Politics was avoided by Mr. Edens in his conversation. My observations, now," he said, "would be entirely along the line of bank work, state and group meetings. Group organization among the bankers is a great thing to bring about reforms and corrections."

In speaking of the trainmen's brotherhood, Mr. Edens was unreserved in his expressions of approval of the order. "It is a great labor organization," he said, "very powerful and very conservative. It has a million dollars in the treasury and has paid out \$15,000,000 in a little more than twenty years. This is an immense sum for the railway men to give from their earnings to the widows and orphans of trainmen. This I believe is a thing to railway men that ought to be recognized throughout the world. The organization creates an improvement in the moral tone of its membership, and is a great asset among the railway employees of today."

PONIES LEARN QUICKLY

Easier to Train Them than Dogs of Gentry Shows.

"It is easier to train ponies or elephants than dogs," said W. W. Gentry, who trains the animals in Gentry Brothers' shows, which have their tents pitched at Thirteenth and Nicollet this week. "I mean it is easier on the trainer. In training ponies or elephants the trainer stands up; in instructing dogs he has to stoop. This makes it tiresome. Animals are all of about the same intelligence, although a dog seems quicker to learn. This is because he is quicker of action. Dogs always seem to perform, and that aids the trainer."

MALPRACTICE APPEAL IN SUPREME COURT

The case of Anna Moore against Dr. Cornelius Williams, both of St. Paul, has been argued and submitted before the state supreme court. The case has been in the courts some time.

Anna Moore had some trouble with her hearing. She alleged, in the first trial in the St. Paul district court, that Dr. Williams operated on her left ear at St. Joseph's hospital, St. Paul, when her trouble was in the right ear; and that as a result of his mistake, she became deaf in the right ear. The jury secured a verdict of something over \$13,000.

Dr. Williams secured a second trial, and introduced much expert testimony to the effect that the operation he performed had practically saved the woman's life. The jury returned a verdict for him.

The present case is an appeal from the verdict in the second trial, taken by Anna Moore. The case was taken under advisement by the supreme court.

MOTHER FINDS LOST SON IN REFORMATORY

Mrs. E. Golar of Minneapolis, after a personal investigation, has located her son, John Golar, at the St. Cloud reformatory.

Mrs. Golar believed the young man had been sent to some penal institution, but did not know where. Investigation of the records at the capitol shows he was committed to the St. Cloud reformatory eighteen months ago from Minneapolis, on an indeterminate sentence for grand larceny in the third degree. The record shows that previous to this sentence, Golar, who is 21, has also served a sentence in the Minneapolis workhouse. Mrs. Golar is German unable to speak English, and did not know what had become of her boy.
