Distinguished Divine Pleads for Popularity in Beverage in the Home.

From staid old Fitchburg, Mass., came the voice of a rector pleading for popularity in the home for the wine of the Alexis W. Stein, rector of Christ Episcopal church of that city and former assistant to the Rev. Dr. John C.
