

DEATH IN WRECK FULFILLS OMEN

Bride Who Lost Husband in British Catastrophe Feared Ill Was Impending.

Journal Special Service. New York, July 4.—It became known yesterday that there was an ill omen attached to the wedding of Miss Antonia Dugro, daughter of Justice and Mrs. Dugro, with Frederick H. Cossitt, who was killed in the railroad wreck at Salisbury, Eng., Sunday morning, which greatly worried the bride. Try as hard as she could she could not shake off the fear that bad luck would follow the wedding because of a hitch in the marriage plans at the last moment.

The ceremony was performed before a large and distinguished company of guests in the ball room of the Hotel Savor the afternoon of June 18. Rev. Dr. William Owen of Mount Vernon, N. Y., an old friend of the Dugro family, had been asked to perform the ceremony and he had expressed his gratification over the prospect.

On the morning of the wedding day the startling news was sent to the bride that Dr. Owen had been stricken with apoplexy and lay at death's door at his home.

BRYAN SPEAKS IN LONDON TONIGHT

Says He Won't Sue Indorsing States for Breach of Promise if They Change.

London, July 4.—William J. Bryan and Mrs. Bryan arrived from Norway late yesterday afternoon. Mr. Bryan went to the Hotel Cecil, where he was soon besieged by callers. Messrs. Bryan, Burns and Stead engaged in an animated discussion of economic and of the social and labor questions. Mr. Bryan received a great mass of American mail.

When Mr. Bryan finished reading his letter he received a deputation of newspaper correspondents, and dictated the following statement: "The suggestion of a reception to me at New York came prior to the action of any of the state conventions and before there was any discussion of the next campaign. It came from the Commercial Travelers' league, of which Mr. Hoge is president. I assured him I should be pleased to meet the members of the league, suggesting that the reception be characterized by simplicity. Now that the action of some of the state conventions have raised the question of political significance to the reception, I am compelled to regard it must not be regarded in the light of a campaign for the presidential nomination. While I appreciate the indorsement of my political views, I do not regard it as binding upon them or upon the party of their states. I shall not prosecute them for breach of promise if they transfer their affections to another. I will not even publish their letters. To allow the reception to be tendered as an indorsement would in the first place be unjust to others, who may be candidates."

There has been no meeting between Mr. Bryan and Mayor McClellan of New York so far. They will both attend the reception of Ambassador Whiteley Reid this afternoon and the dinner of the American society tonight, but it is not probable that anything like a formal conference for the discussion of politics will take place. Mr. Bryan said this morning that he might be going to be coming to this side of the Atlantic, and therefore he was arranging to see them.

Mr. Bryan held another informal reception at the Hotel Cecil today, many visiting and resident Americans calling on him. Colonel E. M. Harvey of New York was among the callers.

FRANTIC FOLK PRAY AS TOWN IS SHAKEN

Albuquerque, N. M., July 4.—Beginning at 3:15 a. m. Socorro, seventy-five miles south of this city, experienced a succession of the severest earthquake shocks within the memory of the people of this section. There were two or three tremors, the first came a loud subterranean rumble, followed immediately by a rocking and swaying that awakened every inhabitant of the city and caused them to scurry into yards and streets for safety. Many of the native people fell upon their knees and prayed aloud for protection. Buildings swayed and creaked, walls were cracked, plaster was shaken from ceilings, doors, windows, dishes and other movable things rattled as the shaken by unseen hands. The disturbance continued severe at intervals of a few minutes for half an hour, then gradually died away, the last of no less than twenty distinct shocks being felt about eight hours later. No serious damage was done.
