LARGE PROFITS MADE BY ITS CULTIVATION. Plenty of Water Is Needed and That the Many Artesian Wells of the State Afford an Exhaustless Quantity.

BY HERBERT VANDERHOOF. Within the past ten years the people of Texas have become intensely interested in the culture of rice, and to this end thousands are today cultivating what is probably the most staple article of food in the world.

The state has twice as much money in banks as either California or Nebraska, about the same as Indiana, 50 per cent more than Connecticut, nearly five times as much as New Hampshire, which leads money all over the Alabama taken together with the other states, three-fourths as much as Massachusetts, almost as much as Texas and more than half as much as Ohio.
