HARGIS ACQUITTED OF MARGUM CRIME

Former Judge and Callahan, Co-Defendant, Freed by Jury—Face Another Trial.

Beattville, Ky., July 17.—The jury in the Hargis-Callahan trial returned a verdict of not guilty after being out twenty-two minutes. The case was one of the most desperately fought battles in Kentucky courts for years. The men were charged with the murder of Attorney Marcum.

The verdict of not guilty in the Marcum trial is the culmination of a long and bitter fight in the courts in an attempt to convict James Hargis and Ed Callahan as chief conspirators in one of the largest crimes in Kentucky's history.

James B. Marcum was a mountain republica lawyer of excellent standing. He was engaged three years ago as an attorney against Hargis and Callahan, respectively democratic county judge and sheriff, to oust them from their offices on an allegation of corrupt election. Much bitterness was aroused and frequent open ruptures occurred.

In May, 1905, Marcum was shot to death from behind in the Jackson courthouse. Curtis Jett and Tom White were convicted and given life terms for the murder. It was charged that they were the tools of Callahan, Hargis and others.

A jury of Clark county citizens returned a verdict for \$8,000 damages a year ago against Hargis on the allegation that he had caused Marcum to be killed. The suit was filed by Mrs. Marcum. Hargis and Callahan are yet to be tried in the Lexington court for the killing of James Cockrill under similar circumstances.

NEW CONSTITUTION BEFORE THE ELKS

Firmer Foundation for Order Is Sought by Grand Lodge—Oppose Negro Elks.

Denver, Col., July 17.—About 25,000 Elks and ladies accompanying them in attendance at the twentieth annual reunion of the order have registered at the local headquarters, and others are still coming on every train.

The grand lodge held its first business session this afternoon. Revision of the constitution is one of the most important matters to come before the convention. The order was established as a social organization and "good fellowship" was one of the prerogatives for membership. So rapid has been the growth of the order that it has been found necessary to broaden this scope and place it on a more solid foundation.

By the adoption of the proposed new constitution three forms of government will be established—executive, judicial and legislative. This will put all the executive power in the hands of the grand exalted ruler, while the judicial duties, such as the arbitration of all questions pertaining to the order, will be placed in the hands of a board of governors or similar body. The legislative power, of course, will develop upon all delegates in convention.

A new ritual also been prepared which is said to be so far superior to the old that there is no question of its ultimate adoption.

Henry J. Darwood, a member of the Philadelphia delegation, will introduce a resolution condemning the use of the Elks' badge by the fraternal, benevolent and protective order of Elks of America, an organization of negroes, and recommending the adoption of an official emblem. The entire negro question will be thoroughly gone over and it is expected that steps will be taken to attempt to prevent the colored organization from using the elk head.

DREYFUS' NEW COMMAND Paris, July 17.—At a meeting of the council of ministers yesterday, War Minister Etienne announced the assignment of Major Dreyfus to the Twelfth regiment of artillery, stationed at Vincennes. This is a crack regiment, which participates in state functions at the capital. Brigadier General Piquart has been designated to serve on the staff of the military governor of Paris.
