EUSTIS SEEKS TO BE CONGRESSMAN

WILL BE A CANDIDATE REGARDLESS OF FLETCHER'S PLANS.

Democratic Congressional Committee, Viewing Fifth as Doubtful District, Brings Every Possible Pressure to Induce John Lind to Enter the Race.

William Henry Eustis will be a candidate for the republican congressional nomination regardless of whether Mr. Fletcher later decides to enter the field or to stay out. Mr. Eustis will file in a few days, thereby formally announcing himself.

The assurance that Mr. Eustis is to enter the congressional race adds new interest to that contest. Three other candidates are already in the field and have filed, Albert H. Hall, W. D. Washburn, Jr., and T. J. Catona. Mr. Fletcher has steadfastly refused to make any announcement since his return, and says that he has not yet made up his mind. This is taken as a sure indication that Mr. Fletcher is planning to be a candidate as soon as he sees the field beginning to split.

Considerable discussion of the proposed informal congressional convention is heard among the republican workers throughout the county. It is believed that a convention of the county organization, to endorse some congressional candidate, will be called soon and that it will bring out the entire organization. Prominent republicans express the opinion that the convention would be a good thing for the party in the fifth congressional district, comprising Hennepin county. If the party workers will endorse a candidate and announce that they will support him and widely so, there is reason to believe that a bad split will be averted.

More than usual interest centers in the congressional contest. The democratic national congressional committee places the fifth Minnesota district in the doubtful column, and for the last year has been bringing every possible pressure to bear to make John Lind re-enter politics and make the run again. Mr. Lind has taken the stand that his personal affairs are too pressing, but may at the last moment be induced to get into the fight. In any case, Mr. Lind will at the request of the national committee give every assistance to the democratic candidate selected by the committee. The democratic plan is said to be to take advantage of splits in the republican ranks because of a fierce primary fight. If an informal congressional convention is called, the candidate securing it will have a strong lead over the field. It is thought that if Mr. Fletcher says he would jump into the race at once and make a fight for it, but the general opinion expressed by workers is to the effect that Mr. Fletcher would have to do some hurrying.

PASSENGER CLEARS ACTE

ST. PAUL MAN THROWS MORE LIGHT ON COLLISION OF STEAMERS AT LAKE MINNETONKA.

Captain Heath of the Acte was not to blame for the collision between the Acte and Comet near Caseo point, Lake Minnetonka, on July 10, according to Edwin E. Blomgren, 441 Virginia avenue, St. Paul. Mr. Blomgren, who was a passenger on the Acte at the time of collision, takes exception to several statements made by Captain Heath of the Comet. In his letter to Governor Johnson, published in The Journal of Friday, and gives the following account of the accident: "Mr. Hawthorne says that the captain of the Acte disregarded the signals of the Comet. All who were aboard the Acte at the time of the accident will testify that Captain Heath did not disregard the comet's signals. The Comet signaled the Acte to go ahead, and then failed to give signals. The Comet signaled the Acte boy."

COLLATERAL EVIDENCE FOUND AGAINST RIGGS

Two more witnesses have been found who could have given damaging evidence if Nathan M. Riggs had not been tried for the murder of Millie Ellison in the National hotel July 10. Clarence Cowing of South St. Paul, who knew Riggs well, says that he saw Riggs talking to Miss Ellison at the National the day before the murder and that Miss Ellison was crying. Another woman was with them but she had nothing to do with the conversation, which was confined to Riggs and the woman who was to be his victim. Walter Preston, a Pullman car porter, told Detective Morrissey that Riggs met him the day before the murder and asked him to take Miss Ellison to the National hotel. The train had just pulled into the Union station and the porter escorted Miss Ellison as he was asked to do. Nothing unusual was said on the way to the hotel and Riggs was only mentioned in a casual way.

CONGRESSIONAL TIMBER

The following is an editorial from the Fergus Falls Journal, whose editor, Elmer Adams was a member of the Minnesota legislature with Mr. Washburn: Hon. W. D. Washburn, Jr., of Minneapolis, has filed as a republican candidate for congress. Mr. Washburn has served in the state legislature two terms and was one of the most valuable members in the last house. He has spent a great deal of time in investigating transportation questions and he was charge of the investigation of the railways during the last session. The report which he wrote on the railway question was one of the most valuable contributions to the literature on the transportation question and has shown an understanding of it that would make him a valuable member of congress. Mr. Washburn is not a radical, but he is far-sighted enough to see that there are conditions which must be improved. He is not only a man of ability, but of high character, and he will be more than an ordinary congressional "pot hunter" around the departments if the people of Hennepin have the sense to send him to represent them.—Ady
