Egan has instructions to forfeit the game to Columbus if the Minneapolis club attempts to play Freeman and Oyer. President O'Brien also says that yesterday's forfeiture will cost Minneapolis \$100 and an additional \$100 for every game which the millers refuse to play.

O'Brien was invited to visit Minneapolis and investigate the trouble, but says he will not go, as he "had reports" from people there. O'Brien says Minneapolis is in danger of losing its franchise if it refuses to abide by the league rules.
