BRYAN MODIFIES MODEL TREATY

His Plan Affecting International Arbitration Is Approved by Interparliamentary Union

London, July 24.—W. J. Bryan's proposed rider to the model arbitration treaty was discussed at a session of the international council of the interparliamentary union this morning, and resulted in its recast as follows:

"If a disagreement should arise which is not included in those to be submitted to arbitration, the contracting parties shall not resort to any act of hostility before they separately or jointly invite, as the case may necessitate, the formation of an international commission of inquiry or mediation, or one or more friendly powers, this request to take place, if necessary, in accordance with article VIII of The Hague convention providing for a peaceful settlement of international conflicts."

On the resumption of the sessions of the conference of the interparliamentary union today, the above was unanimously adopted after speeches by former Austrian Minister of Commerce von Plener, and Mr. Bryan warmly supporting the amended rider. The latter said that his amendment was aimed at widening the scope of arbitration so as to include questions of national honor, the chances being a hundred to one that the proposed investigation of facts would also settle any question of national honor. If the hand of war could be stayed till the conscience awakened, wars would become more remote. The amendment, therefore, was a long step in the direction of peace.

The resolution, as offered by Mr. Bryan originally, follows: "If a disagreement should occur between contracting parties, which in the terms of the proposed arbitration treaty need not be submitted to arbitration, they shall, before declaring war or engaging in any hostilities whatsoever, submit the question to The Hague court or some other impartial tribunal, each party reserving the right to act independently afterwards."

MODEL ARBITRATION TREATY

The Union Adopts Model for Future Treaties.

London, July 24.—Mr. Bartholdt of the United States yesterday expressed particular gratification at the solution suggested by the committee, appointed at Brussels, of the perplexing problem of an international congress. The scheme to convert the next Hague conference into a permanent body which would meet at stated periods and to create a council for the codification and development of international law, he considered so thoroughly practicable and timely that no well-disposed government could object to it. In conclusion Mr. Bartholdt said:

"What we want is a world organization and a system of law and order to replace arbitrary power in international relations."

Congressman T. E. Burton of Ohio, vice president of the American delegation, made the motion that the model arbitration treaty that questions relating to consular and diplomatic privilege and the collection of debts shall be submitted to arbitration.

This was agreed to and the report of the commission appointed at Brussels to prepare a model arbitration treaty for presentation to the powers and the second peace conference at The Hague was adopted.

The meeting also adopted the following proposals of the council: "First—That it would be advantageous to give the Hague conference more permanent influence in the organized functions of diplomacy, and that the powers should agree in establishing periodical meetings of the conference."

Second—That in naming their representatives to the second Hague conference the powers may usefully give them instructions to ascertain the best means of constituting a consultative committee charged with the duty of preparing the codification and development of international law.

SEES HIS WIFE AND DAUGHTERS KILLED

White, S. D., July 24.—Within half view of the husband and father, Mrs. Gus Bernitz and two daughters—Ida, 7 years old, and Ella, 9 years old—were killed today by a load of lumber on the Island train. Bernitz lives one mile south of White.

The mother and two children were carrying Bernitz' dinner to him. To reach the field it was necessary for them to walk a short distance on the track. They were crossing a trestle at the end of which was a sharp curve. Around this curve the train came at full speed, striking the three with such force as to kill them instantly, throwing two of them into the creek and passing over other. The bodies were terribly mangled.


