

CUMMINS MEN SIT DOWN ON TOWNER

'Progressive' Leaders Will Not Accept Standpatter for Convention's Chairman.



JUDGE H. M. TOWNER, Committee's Nominee for Chairman, Rejected by Cummins Majority.

Special to The Journal. Des Moines, July 25.—Bitter enmity between the "standpatter" and "progressive" wings of the republican party in this state broke out afresh today with the announcement that the Cummins men would not accept the state central committee's choice of Judge H. M. Towner of Oreston for temporary chairman of the convention.

Whatever hopes there were of a harmonious settlement of the factional differences have been dashed to the ground, and war to the knife is the prospect which confronts the party. A straight "progressive" ticket will be placed in nomination. Twenty-five "progressive" leaders met at the Savoy hotel and determined that Towner should not sit as temporary chairman, according to the plans of the state central committee, which is controlled by the "standpatters." It was decided that the "progressives" should have the convention offices, for fear of being robbed of the fruits of their victory by former State Senator Thomas D. Healy of Fort Dodge as the Cummins candidate for temporary chairman.

That peace can be purchased only by the unconditional surrender of the standpatter forces, was the position taken by the Cummins leaders who participated in the caucus. A steering committee of seven was named to secure the election of a Cummins man for temporary chairman and otherwise to protect the interests of the Cummins faction.

"No compromise" is the slogan which the progressives have decided to adhere to. The following slate is understood to have been endorsed at the caucus of Cummins' leaders: Governor—A. B. Cummins. Lieutenant Governor—Warren Garst of Coon Rapids. Secretary of State—W. C. Hayward of Davenport.

Treasurer—W. W. Morrow of Afton. Auditor—E. P. Carroll of Bloomfield. Attorney General—H. Webb Byers of Harlan. Judges of Supreme Court—J. C. Sherwin of Mason City, and Emilin McClain of Iowa City. Clerk of Supreme Court—John C. Crockett of Eldora. Superintendent—John F. Riggs of St. Joseph.

Reporter of Supreme Court—W. W. Cornwall of Spencer. Railroad Commissioners—W. L. Eaton of Osage and Eugene Buttles of Burlington. The steering committee selected at the caucus is composed of A. B. Funk of Spirit Lake, Judge S. F. Prouty of Des Moines, Thomas D. Healy of Fort Dodge, E. D. Chassell of Le Mars, A. Smith of Osage, Harvey Ingram of Des Moines, and B. F. Cummins of Marshalltown.

PATE DE FOIS GRAS DOOMED BY NEW LAW

Washington, July 25.—American consumers of pate de foie gras, cervelatwurst, wienersurst, and other choice meat products made abroad, who are not fit enough to live in New York or other seaport cities, will have to go without these palate ticklers after September, when the meat inspection law goes into effect.

The law prohibits the admission into interstate commerce of meat that has not been inspected at the time of slaughter, and this means the passing of the imported frankfurter, pate de foie gras and other compounds with a wurst affixed, so long as the inland population is concerned. Importation of meat products at New York and other seaport cities that are such places are not affected.

CHURCH BELLS ARE MELTED BY LIGHTNING

Chambery, France, July 25.—A cloudburst accompanied by lightning, today destroyed the church of Les Chevannes, about thirty-five miles from here. The lightning melted the church bells into a solid mass. A number of persons were injured. The storm caused an enormous amount of damage along the Franco-Italian border. Railway traffic by way of Mont Genis is interrupted.
