### TRIP TO SKAGUAY MARRED BY STRIKE

SEAMEN MAKE DISTURBING REMARKS TO PASSENGERS.

Minneapolis Man Who Traveled to Alaska Has Many Thrilling Experiences, Including Sight of Iceberg Tumbling Into Sea—Ship Manned by Pick-Up Crew of College Men and Indians.

When a chunk of ice as high as a twenty-story office building, and half a block in area falls into the sea, there is a splash, according to Thomas F. Wallace, who returned yesterday from a trip to Skaguay, Alaska. The particular piece of ice which Mr. Wallace watched on its slide into the sea was part of the famous Taku glacier and the sight was witnessed by the passengers on the steamship Spokane, a Pacific coast line boat which makes trips from Seattle to Skaguay. Mr. Wallace's experiences did not start or end with the glacial phenomenon; there was plenty of other excitement along the route. In speaking of his trip, Mr. Wallace said: "When we arrived in Seattle we were informed that there was a strike among the employees of the Pacific coast line, but we didn't appreciate what it meant until we arrived at the pier to take our boat, the Spokane. We found a brigade with the striking seamen outside and the representatives of the company inside trying to get the passengers and freight aboard. The strikers were not slow in expressing their opinion of people who would travel on the boats of the company and followed along in boats and launches as we steamed out, cheering the passengers with farewell messages. Remember the Slocum and her scab crew," and "Remember the Valencia and her scab crew," yelled the irate sailors, advice which didn't seem to please the ladies on board a bit.

Trouble All Along. "We kept feeling the effects of the strike all thru the trip. College men manned the boat, but the boat was short-handed, the officers picked up men all along the route. At one time a gang of negroes was shipped and then there was trouble among the white men. The matter was finally ended by keeping the men entirely separate. Coming back, Indians were used in making up the crew. The regular cook was hit on the head by a belying pin of some of the dangerous crew early in the game and the passengers were aware of the fact at every meal. But the trip, under ordinary conditions, would be ideal.

"From Skaguay we took the White pass trip, an eye-opener for one who has not been in Alaska. Coming home we had the same trouble with the crew, but otherwise there was little excitement. We left Seattle with a crew of thirty-eight, I believe, and when we returned there were something like 160 men on the ship's list."
