PITTSBURG SOCIETY 'MORALLY ROTTEN'

Father Joseph Toner Denounces the Beau Monde of Smoky City.

New York, Aug. 3.—After a record-breaking trip to Ireland to vote for T. M. Kettle, nationalist member of parliament, the Rev. Joseph Toner, pastor of St. Vincent's Roman Catholic church of Pittsburg, has returned here. He had a denunciation of American society, and Pittsburg society in particular, to deliver.

Speaking of the Thaw case, Father Toner said: "This is another evidence of the moral decline of the rich in this country. So-called fashionable society is so rotten now that it reads one of the days of ancient Rome and Greece. And that is just what we are coming to. We are on the decline morally, and unless some great power makes itself felt in the near future this country will be as Rome was."

Father Toner fully agreed with the views of Cardinal Gibbons and said that although his home was in Pittsburg, he must pronounce the so-called upper society of that city "morally rotten."

"This debauchery and immorality exists almost entirely among the millionaires—men who have come up from almost nothing. These men are really not Pittsburgers, although they are casting a blight upon the name of the city. Just as soon as they gain their wealth they go to New York, London and Paris to spend it in pleasure and debauchery. Pittsburg is too busy for these commercial men."

"I don't know the Thaw family. I believe Harry Thaw should be punished the same as any other person who has committed murder."

FASTS 49 DAYS AND DIES

Exhaustion Causes Death of Man Who Sought to Cure Indigestion.

Detroit, Mich., Aug. 3.—James T. Postlethwait, a clerk in the Michigan Central railroad offices, is dead as the result of fasting for forty-nine days. Postlethwait was troubled with indigestion and was advised to fast to be cured. He began his fast two months ago, and when he abstained from all food for forty-nine days he was pronounced cured.

Instead of taking light diet, Postlethwait ate heartily of fruit and raw food. He was taken ill immediately. His long fast broke the record made by Dr. Tanner.

The physicians say his death was caused by exhaustion and inability to take nourishment.

Postlethwait worked thirty-five out of the forty-nine days that he fasted.
