NOVELIST FAVORED BY THREE PARTIES

Churchill May Head Fusion Ticket in War on Railroad Machine.

Journal Special Service. Boston, Aug. 16.—Winston Churchill, the novelist, as an independent candidate for governor; Winston Churchill as a candidate of the Lincoln republicans; Winston Churchill as the candidate of the democratic party—that, perhaps, will be the lineup in New Hampshire within the next two weeks. The writing reformer, who started in to lead a forlorn hope against the machine rule of the Boston & Maine railroad, which for years has held New Hampshire as one of its assets, will not be the republican candidate for governor, President Tuttle of the Boston & Maine has decreed that, and what President Tuttle says "goes" in New Hampshire so far as the republican party is concerned.

FLOGGING THREATENED, NEGROES FLEE TOWN

Whiteside, Mo., Aug. 16.—Following a series of whippings which has precipitated a race war, the negroes of Whiteside fled from the town and their property and fleeing. Any negro found in the place Saturday night is to be flogged, it is said. The trouble is the outgrowth of a severe whipping which negroes gave James Edleman's 9-year-old son last week. Last Saturday a party of whites, in retaliation, seized a negro boy and whipped him. Later the boy's mother was whipped in a warehouse.

THIRD TERM FOR YOUNG

Upper Peninsula Congressional Convention Proves a Love Feast. Special to The Journal. Marquette, Mich., Aug. 16.—Congressman H. O. Young of Marquette county, now serving his second term, was renominated today at Iron Mountain by the republican convention for the twelfth district, which embraces the entire upper peninsula. The convention was a love feast. There was no opposition to Young and he was named by acclamation. G. M. Smith of Marquette was chairman and Robert H. Shields of Houghton, president of the state tax commission, was secretary. The resolutions were adopted by the administration of President Roosevelt and Governor Warner.


