SIR WILLIAM SAYS HILL IS FOOLISH

Great Northern Magnate Suggests that Canadian Pacific Man Doesn't Grasp Situation.

New York, Aug. 24.—"Two miles of railroad will be built in Great Northern territory for every mile that James J. Hill builds in Canadian Pacific territory," declared Sir William C. Van Horne, chairman of the board of directors of the Canadian Pacific, who has just arrived in this city.
Sir William said Mr. Hill's plan to build a Canadian line from the Pacific ocean to Winnipeg in retaliation for the Canadian Pacific encroachment on Great Northern territory is clearly foolish and probably was a cloak for some plan which is not foolish.
Mr. Hill is also here and said the Canadian Pacific evidently did not have a clear realization of the situation.

LABORERS INFLUENCE RATES

Coast Roads Prepare to Handle Crowds to Coast.
The Northern Pacific, Great Northern and Burlington roads will put colonial rates into effect Aug. 27, instead of Sept. 15, as was expected, and will continue until Oct. 31. The demand for labor is cause for the action.
The rates will be as follows: Twenty dollars to mountain points, \$22.50 to eastern Washington, \$25 to Puget sound and points on north coast, \$34.90 to California.

SMALL GAP TO CLOSE

The Duluth, Missabe & Northern Will Soon Enter Bovey.

Duluth, Minn., Aug. 24.—The extension of the Duluth, Missabe & Northern road from Alberta to Bovey on the western Mesaba range will be completed in a few days. One and a half miles of steel is to be laid to complete the connection between Bengall and Alborn. The road is graded at that point and is ready for the ties and steel. The steel is at hand but exasperating delays have resulted from non-delivery of the ties by contractors.

Trains will be running over the extension by Sept. 1, it is expected. Whether a regular passenger train will be put on this fall or not remains to be seen. If business warrants it will be put on at once, but if not the passenger business will be accommodated by a coach hitched onto a freight train.

There is a large amount of mining machinery to go into the western Mesaba range as soon as trains are put on, but it is said that no ore, beyond possibly a few sample cargoes, will be shipped from there this season.

The Holman and Canisteo mines will have been developed in good shape for heavy shipments by spring.

ROADS FIX CROSSING

St. Louis and North-Western Consult Over Route of Extension.

Aberdeen, S. D., Aug. 24.—An important conference held here between officials of the St. Louis and North-Western roads is to determine where the St. Louis road is to cross the North-Western tracks in its westward extension. The crossing is to be between Conde and Northville, and the conference will determine just where. Construction work is progressing rapidly towards Conde and until the important question of a crossing is determined, the work of laying the steel from that place cannot proceed. It is understood that the North-Western will offer no objection to the route of the line as laid out. Reports received by the Minneapolis & St. Louis road are that steel will be laid to Bradley by tomorrow and to Wallace by the end of this week.

LABORERS APPEAL TO MAYOR

Men Employed by Northern Pacific Refuse to Break Strike.

Duluth, Minn., Aug. 24.—Fifteen of the laborers, who claim to have been hired in Minneapolis under misrepresentation, complained to Mayor Cullom yesterday requesting that he assist them in getting their pay from the Northern Pacific Railway company. They claimed that they were employed to unload coal at 35 cents an hour but were brought here in a locked coach to prevent their escape and put to work in place of the strikers who were going on, they say, fifteen men broke the windows and leaped out of the coach. Mayor Cullom declined to aid the men, as the alleged injustice is not a criminal act.

STRAWTOWN IS BOOMING

New Railroad Brings Prosperity in Car-load Lots.
Lewistown, Mont., Aug. 24.—Corey Brothers, who have a large contract in connection with the construction of the Great Northern extension, have established a camp near Straw composed exclusively of negroes, employing them because of the scarcity of white workmen.
No many laborers are now concentrated near Straw that the county commissioners have decided to locate a deputy sheriff there, a shooting scrape hastening the action. Straw is having a great boom and it is said that general commissary quarters are to be established there at once.

Fair week the Northern Pacific road will run a special train from the twin cities to Fargo, leaving Minneapolis at 9 p.m. and reaching Fargo at 5:15 a.m.
The Great Western will start special tourist car service to Los Angeles and San Francisco next Thursday. The car will leave over the Santa Fe line from Kansas City. The following Tuesday a car will leave over the Rock Island and Rio Grande route from Omaha. Every Monday a car will follow the Thursday route. Every Wednesday a special car will leave for San Francisco.

OPPOSES AN EFFORT TO RAISE HIS SALARY

Belleville, Aug. 24.—In telling the board of the supervisors of St. Claire county that they are making mistake

in urging an increase of \$500 a year in his salary, Probate Judge Fink Perin of Belleville has placed himself in a class of his own. Probate Judge Perin receives \$2,000 a year. The supervisors think the office should command a salary of \$2,500. Speaking as a citizen and taxpayer and not as a selfish office holder, Judge Perin says that the probate judge is receiving plenty.

"I sought the office three years ago, and was glad to get it at a salary of \$2,000," he said. "I am sufficiently satisfied with the job to seek re-election next fall and \$2,000 looks big enough to those others to induce them to seek the position also. If men are willing to accept the office for \$2,000 a year, why should the supervisors insist upon raising the salary to \$2,500?"
