LEOPARDS ESCAPE, TERRORIZE TOWNS

Wisconsin Posse Would Hunt Down Cattle Killing Animals from Ringlings' Menagerie.

Necedah, Wis., Aug. 31.—Three leopards from Ringling Brothers' circus menagerie have terrorized the residents of the towns of Necedah, Arkdale, New Lisbon, Mauston, Cranbury, Center, Babcock and surrounding counties for five days. The animals escaped from their cage Saturday night as the cages were being loaded on trains at Necedah.

Posses from all of the towns, armed with shotguns, rifles and revolvers, have hunted the leopards for several days. Their first success came Wednesday night, when one was shot in the barnyard of Peter R. Stivers, three miles south of here, by Henry Samson of Arkdale. The animal had killed one cow and was crouching for a spring at another when discovered by Samson.

Not a child has been allowed outside the doors of the homes, and even women are afraid to go out at night. Every house, barn and shed in which the human race and the domestic animals are harbored has been doubly locked and barricaded. Firearms which have not been used for years have been cleaned and oiled. Every man, woman and child is on the watch for the dreaded beasts.

Cattle Their Prey.

Sunday afternoon Frank M. Reid, town chairman, received word that three head of cattle had been killed on the farm of James Williams, north of the village. Monday reports were received from Arkdale, New Lisbon and Cranbury Center that the animals had been seen prowling in the woods on the outskirts of these places. The same night Dr. G. H. Parham, one of the Necedah posse, sighted the leopards on Frank Hudson's farm and fired three shots, but missed. Tuesday morning Frank M. West discovered that four of his cattle had been killed. Three cattle were killed on Hudson's farm late Tuesday night. William Greenburg and his sons, Morris and Fred, discovered the animals in a stretch of timber west of here at dusk Wednesday night. Reinforced by other residents, they scoured the woods, but were unsuccessful. The last report received gave the number of cattle killed as seventeen.

FARLEY GETS RED HAT, SOON, PALMIERI DECLARES

New York, Aug. 31.—That Archbishop Farley of New York is likely to get the red hat very soon, perhaps before the end of the present year, is the statement made by former Judge John Palmieri, who was a passenger on the steamer Princess Irene. Mr. Palmieri also said it was his belief that the honor of the cardinalate seemed to lie between Archbishop Farley and Ireland and that the former was apparently in the greatest favor with the pope.

In an interview with the pope, last night, said Mr. Palmieri, "the holy father spoke in terms of the greatest enthusiasm of Archbishop Farley. There was more than a hint in the pope's remarks that the archbishop of New York would be advanced to a cardinalship and Merry Del Val, the Vatican secretary of state, seemed to make this absolutely certain when he made the Archbishop Farley his warmest greetings."
