HOOSIER SENATOR TO OPEN CAMPAIGN

BEVERIDGE WILL BE GUEST OF CITY SATURDAY.

Indiana People to Form Receiving Committee at Railway Station and Many Receptions Are Planned—Auditorium Meeting Expected to Cover National, State and Local Issues.

Senator Albert J. Beveridge of Indiana will be the honored guest of Minneapolis tomorrow, and tomorrow evening he will be the chief speaker at the Auditorium opening the republican campaign in Hennepin county.

Senator Beveridge will come from Chicago tonight, arriving by the Northwestern at 9:30 a. m. Saturday. He will be met at the Union station by a reception committee of former Indiana people, constituted as follows: S. T. Johnson, chairman; E. M. Best, Judge J. L. Best, C. C. Evans, E. H. Favors for Visitor.

In arrangements for his entertainment the senator's wishes will be consulted. If possible a public reception at the Commercial club will be arranged, and, at any rate, the senator's visit will be the occasion for a reunion of Indian people. After the evening meeting he will be entertained at a private dinner at the Minneapolis club by Mrs. William E. Lee of 625 Main street, S. T. Johnson being the guest.

Speaks by the Card.

The principal address of the evening will be made by Senator Beveridge, and will probably close the program. He is one of the ablest orators in the country, and a strong exponent of Roosevelt republicanism, so the address is looked forward to as a thro statement of republican doctrine, especially with reference to the railway and trust problems.

The box seats on the left side of the Auditorium stage have been reserved for the Indiana women, and will be appropriately decorated with flags and a portrait of Oliver P. Morton.

St. Paul Wants Him.

St. Paul republicans tried today to get Senator Beveridge to come over and address a noon meeting tomorrow, but found the arrangements for the entire day had been perfected by the Minneapolis reception committee, including a reception and an automobile tour, so they gave up trying to bring the visitor to St. Paul. A number will come over from the sister city to the Auditorium meeting.

A good many are expected in from other towns. The state committee headquarters has heard from a number who will come to hear Beveridge, and Chairman Cole has invited all county committeemen who may be in the city to the fall opening at the auditorium tomorrow afternoon for an informal conference.

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
