SPITE, SHE ASSERTS, LOCKED IN TOMBS

Spurned Packer Had Her Arrested as Revenge, Declares Mrs. Ura Brown.

Journal Special Service.

New York, Sept. 28.—Declaring that her incarceration in a Tombs cell is the result of spite on the part of a wealthy Milwaukee pork packer, whose attentions she says she resented, Mrs. Ura Brown of this city and her husband, Harry C. Brown, united in asserting that the charge against them of having stolen \$3,000 in diamonds was false.

The couple were arraigned in the Tombs police court after they had been arrested at the request of Chief of Police Jansen of Milwaukee, who was held in \$1,500 bail for further examination. Brown, whose real name is said to be Gordon and who is said to be the son of a wealthy Milwaukee rabbi, is employed as a chemist in a Maiden Lane jewelry house. His employers offered to go on his bond, but he refused to accept his liberty unless his wife is also freed.

According to the police, the couple are wanted in the western city where it is asserted the woman, under the name of Thomas Connor, engaged her self as a maid in the pork packer's household and when the family was absent, it is alleged, she made way with the gems.

Became too Attentive.

When seen in the Tombs Mrs. Brown is young and attractive, seemed willing to discuss the case. She asserts that while it is true that she was at one time employed in the home of Frank F. Faustman, a wealthy and prominent Milwaukeean, she only worked there ten days and that the story of the jewel theft is a pure fabrication. She says that her beauty attracted the pork packer and that he gave her several diamonds. Finally, she declares, he became so attentive that she was compelled to leave his service.

Edward Campbell, a lawyer who was retained by the couple, declares that the diamonds in question are worth at least \$10,000 and not \$3,000 as the complaint asserts, but he denies that his clients are in any way responsible for their disappearance.

ROBBERY MYSTERY SOLVED BY ARREST

Plot to Get Butcher's Gems and Slay Him, Cleared, the Police Say.

Chicago, Sept. 28.—The arrest of Clara Adams, an actress, and Harry Morgan at Salt Lake City will solve the mystery connected with the alleged theft of nearly \$10,000 from Anton Fritz, a butcher, at Portland, Ore., and of an alleged plot to murder Morgan in a hotel in Chicago, according to the local police authorities who were notified of the arrests.

Fritz came from western Pennsylvania. There he owned a butcher shop which he sold for \$10,000 and started for the west. In Portland he met Miss Adams. She told him she was a stranger there and needed money. Fritz asserted that he befriended the woman and provided her with quarters in a hotel where he had been staying.

Woman Disappears.

The next morning he reported that he had been robbed of over \$9,000. In the meantime the woman disappeared. The description given of the woman as Fritz was recognized by the police as that of a woman known under the name of the "Candy Kid." Harry Morgan, a friend of the woman, also had disappeared.

The police learned that Morgan and the woman had gone to Tacoma, Spokane, thence to St. Paul and finally to Chicago. At each place it was learned that Morgan and the woman had been living in luxury.

The conspiracy to kill Morgan probably would have been successful, according to the police, but for the weakness of one of the plotters, a negro, who went to Morgan and made a full confession.

Tell Another Story.

Portland, Ore., Sept. 28.—The facts of the Anton Fritz robbery here as known to the police of Portland are at variance with the story received from Chicago. Anton Fritz arrived in this city with more than \$10,000 in cash, which he was not slow in displaying around his brother's saloon in this city.

Harry Morgan and Clara Adams, who were frequenters of the place, are said to have concocted a scheme for obtaining Fritz's wealth, in pursuit of which one day, about a month ago, the woman lay in wait for him on the steps of the First Baptist church. She appeared in great distress, and her crying attracted Fritz, to whom she told a pitiful tale of ill treatment. Fritz gave her a few dollars to console her and in pretended gratitude the woman threw her arms about his neck. When Fritz arrived at his home \$9,400 in bills was missing.

Fritz reported the robbery to the police, but later he tried to have the case dropped because of the peculiar situation it had placed him in and because he feared the consequences if the crime should become known in the east.

MRS. DOWIE SEEKS MANSION

Declares That Husband Coerced Her Into Parting with Home.

Muskegon, Mich., Sept. 28.—Mrs. Jane Dowie has begun suit in Muskegon county to have two deeds transferring Ben Mac D'Hui, the \$250,000 summer mansion at Wind Lake set aside. Deeds were made Sept. 8, 1905, and Mrs. Dowie alleges that John Alexander Dowie coerced her into transferring property thru threats of suicide and other scandalous stories about her character. The bill contains stories even more startling than recent tales from Zion City.
