ALLEGED RAILROAD TRUST ON TRIAL IN ST. LOUIS
St. Louis, Oct. 7.—The hearing of the government suit to dissolve the alleged combination of the Terminal Railway association began today before Special Commissioner R. E. Rombauer. The suit is based on the government's declaration that the Sherman antitrust law is being violated by the alleged monopoly of carrier and railroad interests among St. Louis railroads.

The government expects to complete its case by Oct. 20 as agreed between counsel, and the defense will then have ten days to introduce its evidence. When the evidence has been taken by Commissioner Rombauer it will be submitted to the United States circuit court of appeals. It is expected that the trial will reach its body in time for commencement of the trial on Oct. 20. Sixty-one witnesses in behalf of the government have been subpoenaed. Former Attorney General Crow of Missouri is senior counsel for the government.

IN ASYLUM OR DEAD? SUIT WILL DETERMINE
St. Louis, Oct. 7.—The trial of an insurance suit was begun today in the United States circuit court to determine whether George C. The suit involves the payment of \$5,000 life insurance.

Rome, Oct. 7.—The statements made yesterday by the French—M. Sarrien and Interior Minister—concerning the subject of church and state separation law in France, have much impressed the Vatican.

The pope said that the attacks of the French ministers are not justified as he had always been inspired for love for France and had never been affected by German or other foreign influences. He added that he drafted the last encyclical according to the rights of the church and sentiments of the French clergy, as proved by their unanimous adhesion to it.
