FUNSTON FIGHTER KILLED AT BUTTE

Murder of Austin O'Malley Is Charged to Major W. E. Deeney.

Butte, Mont., Nov. 12.—Austin O'Malley, 37 years of age, a veteran of the Spanish-American war and said to have been one of the foremost to follow General Frederick Funston in his famous swim across the Bag-Bag river in the Philippines, is dead in the hospital here from the effects of a wound said to have been inflicted by Major W. E. Deeney. Deeney is under arrest charged with murder. The cutting occurred last Sunday and is said to have been entirely without provocation. O'Malley is said to have been seated in a saloon discussing politics with several friends when Deeney suddenly entered and slashed him across the face with a knife. The wound was not thought to be dangerous, but complications later ensued which caused death. Major Deeney has been a resident of Butte for many years and has the reputation of being a peaceful and law-abiding citizen. He refuses to talk about the case.

HETTY GREEN TRUSTS' FOE

Richest Woman Declares Giant Combines Will Bring War.

Journal Special Service. Boston, Nov. 12.—Mrs. Hetty Green, richest woman in the United States, would hardly be expected to be a trust-buster. Yet Mrs. Green is against the trusts. She thinks them as iniquitous as lawyers. When Mrs. Green says trusts are as bad as lawyers it is the limit of her condemnation. "There is going to be a revolution in this country," she says, "and the people are going to revolt against the oppressions of the trusts. There will be a deluge and these streets will run with blood when the people are aroused. The trusts are gradually finding out about the trusts."

PERIL IN BIRTH DECREASE

France Worried Over Reports of Increasing Race Suicide.

Paris, Nov. 12.—Public attention again has been drawn to the peril involved in the constantly diminishing birth rate, by the publication of the vital statistics for 1905. The births in France for this year numbered 807,292, showing a decrease of 110,927 from the total of 1904. The reason for this decrease is not to be found in a reduction of the number of marriages, in which the statistics show a slight increase over 1904, but it apparently arises from the aversion of the French people to raising large families.

BEGGARS SCORNED IN SAGE CHARITY

Only Worthy Will Participate in Distribution of Vast Hoard.

New York, Nov. 12.—Reports that the widow of Russell Sage meant to use her many millions of dollars to endow a home for aged teachers and in a fund to educate young men for the church have drawn the attention of the first definite statement of her wishes and purposes. She announces that the thousands who have besieged her in impudent request for money, feeling that they stretch from college presidents to ordinary street beggars—have wasted their time. She will have none of them. Further, she is loath to endow a church or institution, feeling that the absence of need brings lack of activity for good.

ELECTRICITY RULES LIFE OF HUMANS

San Francisco Doctors Declare Experiment Proves Source of All Action.

San Francisco, Nov. 12.—Before a number of medical men and scientists Drs. Albert J. Atkins and E. J. Lewis have succeeded in charging an electrical circuit with human electricity to such a degree that external sound waves were transmitted and heard thru an ordinary telephone. The experiment consisted of the application of two platinum electrodes to the walls of the living stomach. By means of copper wires the electrodes were connected with a telephone and microphone, a sensitive instrument which greatly intensifies sound. There was absolutely no mechanical or chemical battery in the circuit, yet the moment the electrodes were swallowed sufficiently to touch the walls of the stomach, human electricity flowed over the wires, rendering audible sounds. The electric charge measured from 7 to 8 millivolts on a Weston galvanometer.

Electricity Governs All.

Doctors Atkins and Lewis asserts that by this experiment they have demonstrated the law of action of the human senses. They reason that if sound is transmitted over a copper wire when it is charged with human electricity, it is reasonable to consider the principle the same when the auditory nerve is charged with the same force. In other words, when the auditory nerve is made sensitive to human electricity on the same principle by which we receive a telephone message. Furthermore, these scientists claim that by a series of experiments they have proved that the action of an electro-chemical process, that all life action in the body is dependent upon the activity of the electrical forces within the organism, and that variations of sense manifestation, as sight, hearing, etc., are caused by the different rates of vibration set up by the human electrical currents, acting on the special sense nerves.

STABBED WITH HATPIN, DIES SHIELDING WOMAN

Seranton, Pa., Nov. 12.—Thomas Dougherty, a prominent young man of Dunmore, is dead as the result of being stabbed by an unknown woman. His death is mysterious.

The police say the woman told them that she had started the fire because she "wanted to see the people run out."
