MORE TEACHERS NEEDED IN IOWA

New Law Blamed for Shortage—Trend Is Toward Consolidated Schools.

Mason City, Iowa, Nov. 23.—Iowa is beginning to feel the reaction as a result of the operation of the new school law governing the certifications of teachers. Reports from all parts of the state indicate a shortage of teachers for the winter term and the condition is fast approaching a crisis. The effect is most noticeable in the rural schools, and especially among teachers who formerly held second and third grade certificates.

The fact that the teachers are compelled to take an examination which is governed by a board and to submit their papers to that board which has declared that accuracy is the only requisite for safety in holding their positions and former certificates, has produced little less than a panic, especially among the younger teachers.

Superintendent Mahannah of this county is advertising for teachers to fill the country schools. There are more than a dozen schools in the county that want teachers, and unless they can be found the schoolhouses will be closed. State Superintendent Biggs has sent out notices allowing superintendents of counties, where there is a shortage of teachers, to issue what is termed a provisional certificate. In a few cases this has been done, but not often enough to supply the demand.

Among school men in general there is a general sentiment that it will drive them to the consolidated schools. While that movement is being resisted in this county by a large element, it is believed it must be had or nothing. The schools are in a demoralized condition and some heroic measures will have to be adopted to bring them up again.
