Wheels and Telegraph Instruments of Big System Silent for Five Minutes.

Journal Special Service. Washington, Dec. 3.—For the first five minutes after 2 p.m. yesterday, during the funeral services of President Samuel Spencer, the business of the Southern railway was at a complete standstill.

J. P. Morgan Weeps. J. Pierpont Morgan walked at the head of the pallbearers on entering and leaving the church.

Among the prominent government officials at the funeral were Vice President Fairbanks, Secretary Keen, New Jersey, Bacon of Georgia, Martin of Virginia, Overman of North Carolina, Justices White and Harlan of the United States supreme court.

Practically every railway system was represented. In addition to J. P. Morgan, there were a number of capitalists from New York.


