

SANE, BUT KEPT IN A MADHOUSE

South Dakota Rancher, Just Released from an Asylum, Tells Extraordinary Story.

Special to The Journal. Kimball, S. D., Dec. 5.—W. H. Brearly, a college graduate and well-known ranchman of Buffalo county, is here on his way to his home at Gann Valley, having just been released from the Yankton insane asylum, where he has been kept since June 19 on the supposition that he was insane.

Some time ago Brearly mailed letters to various newspapers, stating he had been incarcerated without an examination by the board of insanity of Buffalo county, and asserting further that his efforts to secure an examination at the state asylum had proved futile. He begged his friends to bring to bear what influence they could upon the board of charities and corrections of South Dakota to secure his release, or, at least, an examination into his mental condition.

The letter was evidently written by a man in full possession of his mental faculties and the board at its recent meeting, had Brearly before it, and immediately ordered his release.

Brearly says his trouble dated from the campaign early last summer when he sought to go as delegate to the republican state convention. He is a leader of the insurgent forces in Buffalo county. He was defeated and used some rather strong language with the result that he was arrested, placed in jail seventeen days, and then sent to the asylum without an opportunity for a hearing.

Since his release he declares the motive for placing him in the asylum were two-fold. Aside from the political phase he says the Brearly Bros. ranch of 1,800 acres in Buffalo county has a mortgage of \$6,000 against it, and that if he could have been kept in the asylum, there was a chance, he alleges for the mortgages to secure a \$20,000 ranch for their claim. The mortgage is now being foreclosed and the sale is to take place in a few days unless Brearly can secure a restraining order from the court.

The ballroom echoed with cries as Shainwald jumped to his feet and closed with Zeman. They fought furiously until several of the older members of the club rushed in and separated them.

The children were burned beyond recognition.
