The average temperature for January in the period covered by the records was 24.2 degrees.

GOOD YEAR'S WORK DONE BY THE POLICE

RECORD OF YEAR PRACTICALLY CLOSES TODAY.

Not a Saloon Has Been Open on Sunday, Gambling Has Been Suppressed and Other Evils Curbed—Many Arrests Made in Grave Crimes and Perpetrators Now Serve Time.

Today will practically close the police record for the administration of Mayor D. P. Jones, and altho Police Superintendent Doyle, according to custom, will stay until Jan. 7, 1907, work done during the next week will be credited to the Haynes administration.

The work of the department for the year has been steady and has brought good results. The policy of the mayor was faithfully carried out and not a saloon has been open on Sunday during the entire year.

More than fifty persons have been convicted of keeping blind pigs and there has been no public gambling. Gambling houses where attempts were made to break the laws, were promptly raided and in nearly every case convictions followed.

The rule laid down two years ago for the restriction of the social evil has been rigidly enforced.

Criminals Are Few. At times the detective staff was berated, but Police Superintendent Doyle says the records will bear him out when he says that the sleuths were unusually successful in tracing criminals.

One failure, he says, is much more noticeable than a dozen good arrests, but on the whole life and property have been well protected and the city is well cleaned of the criminal class.

There were nine cases of homicide in the year. These were the murder of the six Macedonians, of Frank O. Grain, Albert Dore, John Harmonac, Millie Allison, Fannie Susman, Roma Shields, Joseph Gardout and William A. Dowell.

Of these nine cases arrests were made in six; convictions were secured in four, and one case is still pending. Nathan Riggs, arrested for the murder of Millie Ellison, committed suicide before he could be tried.

Robbers Sent Up. There were more than the usual number of arrests and convictions for highway robbery, grand larceny and burglary.

The department has sent its share of robbers to Stillwater.

For the first time in the west automobiles have been used extensively in police work.

Detectives have been hurried to the scenes of crime in speeding automobiles, and several robberies have been frustrated by the prompt arrival of the police.

The total number of arrests is about the same as last year. Up to noon Saturday there had been 7,320 arrests on all charges. Nearly half of these were for drunkenness, but the others were for more serious offenses.

Superintendent Doyle is especially proud of the work of the patrolmen who made many of the important arrests, including the arrest of James J. Drunkan, the act of blowing a safe at 915 May place.
