War Relief Women Spend Busy Hours

Workers at Headquarters Each Morning Preparing Articles for Shipment Abroad.

One of the most interesting features in connection with the work of the War Relief Association of Virginia is the gathering of faithful women each morning during the week in the headquarters of the association in the Allison Building on East Main Street, to receive, arrange and pack the various articles that pour in to be shipped to the war zone. Each day the rooms are in charge of one particular woman, and all the work done is under her direction. There are few idle moments, for when there is nothing pressing to be attended to, the women all join in making up hospital supplies and other articles for which there is such great need. There is always plenty of work in the headquarters rooms, and any woman who feels interested will receive a cordial welcome and opportunity to help in this service for humanity. Last week the workers in the headquarters room turned in the following articles: forty wide-rolled bandages, sixty narrow, 100 gauze compresses, 100 linen compresses, forty gauze packings, five slings, seven binders, one pneumonia jacket, eighty bandages, one fracture pillow, fifteen poultice absorbent, fifteen scullion bandages, twenty moose bandages, ten band binders.

The joint committee of the British Red Cross Society and the Order of St. John of Jerusalem, in a weekly statement says there is now a sufficient stock of warm clothing on hand to last for the remaining cold months and the requirements now are for pajamas, nightshirts, bed jackets, day shirts, also walking sticks, old linen, kitchen rubbers, floor cloths, blankets, sheets, towels and pillows, also natural rubber bandages, rolled bandages, absorbent gauze and aspirin tablets.

From Mrs. John Kerr Branch's children's section there was received yesterday ten complete infant kits being the weekly contribution of that band of workers. Each kit contains twenty-three different articles and there is a great amount of work connected with their completion.

A. M. E. CONFERENCE

Semi-Centennial Session Opens Here With Bishop Coppin Presiding.

The semi-centennial conference of the African Methodist Episcopal Church of Virginia convened yesterday morning in the Third Street Bethel Church, colored, with Bishop L. J. Coppin, of Philadelphia, presiding.

The conference, which will be resumed this morning at 9:30 o'clock, will continue through Sunday.

A large number of local colored clergymen were present at the opening exercises.

At the afternoon session "Uncle" John Traxham, of Halifax County, presented to the conference a church, erected at a cost of \$2,500, upon one acre of land, which he has acquired through many years of hard labor. "Uncle John" is the owner of more than 200 acres of land in Halifax which he has accumulated during the past half-century.

[Special to The Times-Dispatch.] GREENSBORO, N. C., April 5.—The Progressive State Executive Committee,




